

Parish Council Elections - 7th May 2020 - Cancelled!

2020 is no longer an election year! Many of you will already have heard that all local elections have been cancelled for this year. This means that all Councillors will continue in post and the elections will now be held in 2021. Further information will follow in due course as and when I receive it.

Council Tax Charge for Freeland

I know many of you will have received your Council Tax bill and may have been shocked to see a 10.5% increase showing on the Freeland PC section. The reason for the increase showing so high is actually in relation to how WODC calculate the Council Tax, and the fact that last year they overestimated how many homes would be built (and occupied) at the new Witney Road development. In reality, the actual percentage increase the Parish Council will receive in Council Tax is only 2.5% higher than last year, but due to the way this is calculated at WODC, it shows as a 10.5% increase. It's not an easy thing to explain, but please see an explanation that Alaa has written for the Grapevine this month (page 15) which I hope will clarify the situation.

Little Free Library

On a brighter note, the official opening of the new Little Free Library by the Village Hall was held on **Saturday 7**th **March** and was well attended. The new library is now up and running and is a fantastic addition to the village which the Council hopes will be enjoyed by many. Thanks once again to Matthew for his work on getting this project completed.

YOUR PARISH COUNCIL CHARGE EXPLAINED

By the time you read this, you will have received your Council Tax Bill from West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) for the year commencing I April 2020. If you look at the details of the charges made by each authority and the percentage they have increased by, you may be surprised to see that Freeland Parish Council charge has increased by I 0.5% and you may be rightly wondering why this much when the increases in the other authorities' charges are at most 5%!

Paradoxically, although you might expect the explanation to be disturbingly negative, it is actually joyfully positive! Allow me first to note that the Parish Council charge is the result of dividing (1) the total Parish Council Precept (i.e. amount needed) by (2) the expected number of dwellings in Freeland in the coming year (adjusted to the equivalent to Band D dwellings). This calculation is made by WODC for all Town and Parish Councils who are guaranteed to get the Precept they set and any variations go into a fund that is then shared between the other charging authorities. WODC is the collection agency on behalf of the County Council (accounting for the biggest charge) Thames Valley Police and Town or Parish Councils.

The Freeland Parish Precept for 2020-21 is £62,494 which is only 2.5% higher than a year earlier and only 5.8% higher than five years earlier. About half of the Precept goes towards repaying the loans on the Village Hall and the rest is kept to a minimum thanks to prudent financial management by the Parish Council.

The calculations for the past two years, i.e. 2018-19 and 2019-20, assumed that a certain number of houses at Oakland Grange on the Witney Road would be completed and occupied. But the pace of construction had been slower than expected so, for those two years, the Parish Council charge fell by 6.6% and 2.7% respectively. We were all undercharged! If it were not for that undercharging, the increase in the coming year would be only 1.4% per dwelling based on the completion of around a handful of new houses.



In this time of National Crisis and in response to residents' requests, we have provided a Food Bank, so that residents in Freeland do not have to go hungry.

This has been set up in a box behind the bus shelter by the village hall and will run purely on a **trust and honesty** basis, so please don't abuse it.

PLEASE, only take things that you genuinely need.

Remember, whilst we are fortunate enough to live in an affluent village, we also have many key workers amongst us who are more than likely struggling to get the food they need after long, exhausting shifts.

DONATIONS:

We can only accept non-perishable food items such as rice, pasta, tins, jars of sauce, packet mixes, long life cartons of juice, etc. We cannot accept any fresh food including bread.

Please ensure all items left in the box are well within their use-by/best-before date as this box will only be checked on an ad hoc basis.

You can also donate additional items such as toiletries and sanitary products, toilet roll (must be wrapped for hygiene reasons and to ensure it does not get damp), cleaning supplies, disposable cutlery, paper plates and bowls – but no clothing, toys, textiles or small electrical goods.

If possible, before and after using the food bank, can you wash your hands and disinfect/wipe down any items that you put in or take out. Please ensure the lid of the box is replaced securely as rainwater runs off the shelter roof onto the boxes.

Please place your items in the box and give yourself some credit for doing something lovely for your community!

Someone, somewhere in this village will be so grateful for your generosity.

COVID - 19 MUTUAL AID FREELAND

What Volunteers can do:

Local volunteers can assist with:

- Shopping
- Dog walking
- Collecting prescriptions
- Taking things to/collecting items from post offices
- Any other local errands that can be conducted over the doorstep
- · Chatting on the phone

What Volunteers cannot do:

- Enter the homes or cars of vulnerable people
- Provide personal care
- Handle personal or valuable items
- Handle bank cards or PIN numbers

Advice to volunteers:

- Do not enter people's homes or cars
- Abuse of vulnerable people will not be tolerated and will be reported to the police
- Always let someone know where you are going and what time you expect to be back
- · Keep a mobile phone on you at all times
- Do not share personal details of beneficiaries or other volunteers
- Be prepared to show ID to the beneficiary if requested
- \bullet Do not take or share photos of beneficiaries or other volunteers without permission
- Follow GDPR rules regarding personal data.
- Don't over commit yourself it's better to help a little and often than a lot but only once
- If at any point you develop symptoms or think you may have been in contact with someone who has then isolate yourself and contact Lisa or Vero so your street can be re-allocated.

Advice to beneficiaries:

- Volunteers do not expect payment for their time you should only pay for shopping or other expenses you would normally cover
- Do not invite volunteers into your property shopping and other goods can be left on doorsteps to avoid infection
- If a volunteer is walking your dog then you should provide poo bags and other essentials. If necessary, muzzle your dog before the volunteer arrives
- Abuse of volunteers, verbal, racial, sexual or otherwise, will not be tolerated and will result in you being blacklisted and reported to the police
- If you feel that a volunteer is behaving in an unacceptable manner then please report it to $01993\ 651330$

General infection control advice:

- Follow all WHO advice regarding infection control. Wash your hands regularly. There should be no direct physical contact between volunteers and beneficiaries
- Volunteers should wash their hands before and after every contact with a beneficiary

- Shopping should be left at front doors cash/cheques can be left in an envelope to avoid contact or use a click and collect service
- If at any point you or a member of your household develop symptoms, or you think you may have been in contact with someone suffering from COVID-19 then you should self-isolate
- When handling dog leads wear gloves. Disposable gloves are ideal and should be discarded after use. If not possible then wear re-usable gloves and wash immediately after use.

As a necessary precaution during the current public health emergency, the Freeland Community Bus Committee took the decision to **suspend operations** from **Thursday 19th March** until further notice. Before attending any GP appointment, all patients will need to speak to a GP first. PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND THE SURGERY TO SEE A GP IF YOU HAVE NOT SPOKEN TO A GP. Nursing appointments will continue as usual for now. If you feel you need to be seen, please arrange a telephone appointment with your GP. If you already have an appointment booked DO NOT ATTEND THE SURGERY.

You will receive a phone call on the day of your appointment. If it is clinically appropriate, the doctor will then see you the same day. This action is essential to maintain your health and the health of your community as advised by the Department of Health If your query is about Coronavirus go to III.nhs.uk/covid-19 or call III

At the time of writing (20/3/20), it is still OK to go to the surgery to collect prescriptions from the Pharmacy (Hanborough) or Dispensary (Eynsham). Please allow **FOUR** working days from ordering a prescription.

Also, readers should keep up-to-date with <u>official</u> UK Government Advice/ Instructions, which can change daily, <u>and not</u> various social media sites and platforms which can be very unhelpful with scams or worse.

OXFORD UNIVERSITY HOSPITALS: Covid-19 - New rules on visitors to our hospitals (issued 16/3/20)

With immediate effect, we are limiting visiting to all adult inpatient areas to **one** visitor per patient - and visiting hours will be restricted to **4.00pm - 7.00pm** only.

We are also limiting the number of people who can accompany patients to our Emergency Departments, Emergency Assessment Units (EAU), outpatient departments, antenatal scans and imaging appointments to one person per patient.

FARMING WITH NATURE - Farm Diary - February 2020

February is traditionally the month of heavy rainfall...'February fill dyke!' Aided by storms Ciara and Dennis, the dykes have had their fill. A mild wet winter has kept soil temperatures high, the primroses are in flower and the snowdrops, now past their best. Hedges uncut, display racemes of yellow hazel catkins and, as the buds swell, the hawthorn shows purple against the horizon...the bark of the field maple, golden brown and patches of wild plum already in full blossom.

A quiet month on the farm, the cows are heavily pregnant, chilled out, serene, until that is the next storm tears across the open yards, moving the cows into perfect formation, heads down, tails windward like multiple weather-veins or, boats moored in an incoming tide. During the last 6 weeks of gestation, the unborn calf can double its weight so, care has to be taken with the cows' diet or calving problems may result.

Assorted crows (Rooks, Jackdaws and Magpies) pick amongst the straw bedding for food, hopping over the backs of oblivious cows as they go. Although sometimes a problem, Rooks are, on balance, the farmers friend, feeding on soil borne grubs such as leather jackets. Rooks are intelligent, communicative and well organised. The Rookery in Church Hanborough has remained constant since my childhood. The nests, in the top of the huge Horse Chestnut trees beside the Church yard, are repaired in early winter and again in late February, ready to receive eggs laid in March. Few people will have looked into a Rook's nest of woven twigs, precariously perched amongst the flimsy upper branches to see four beautiful eggs; light blue, heavily speckled twig brown, for perfect camouflage.

If anything optimises our farm, it is the hedgerows. Over many decades, I have attempted to shape them in to interlinking networks of wildlife corridors. Some cut tight and dense, most cut in a three to four-year cycle. Other hedges, in appropriate locations, containing fruit bearing varieties (i.e. Hawthorn, Blackthorn, Crab apple etc) are left to grow big and produce as much pollen, nectar and fruit as possible. When parts of these bigger hedges become unmanageable, they are cut and laid in the traditional way. This mixed approach to management gives great diversity of habitat and an interesting landscape. Hedges flailed annually may look tidy but produce little pollen, nectar or fruit. With more focus on biodiversity and carbon sequestration, it may be that the humble hedgerow will be elevated in importance and looked upon as a national treasure once again. 250,000 miles of hedges exist...most of them brutally overmanaged.

The flood water on our lower fields, sparkles in a brief moment of sunshine. Looking south across City Farm, from the higher ground, I can see the sheep grazing my red clover crop, beside the A40 at Eynsham...and beyond, through the naked trees, the iridescent flooded meadows stretch to Oxford...a view of rural beauty. Flood meadows are meant to flood but, in the 1970s and 80s, many were drained and ploughed for arable production. They still flood, but drain too quickly, eroding the soil and silting up the rivers.

As climate change becomes reality, this is something that can be quickly remedied, returning and reinstating to erosion resistant pastures, biodiverse flood meadows.

February ends with light snow.

It will be sometime before the fields are dry enough for spring planting to commence. In the meantime, we await the arrival of our first calves...March beckons.
