FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL - LISA'S NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 15th MARCH 2021

Parish Council Elections - 6th May 2021

Another plug for the forthcoming elections! It's local council elections on **Thursday 6th May** this year, which means it's election time for your Parish Council. If you would like to become more involved in your village and have a say about matters that affect Freeland, please do consider joining the Parish Council. We meet once a month in the evening on the 3rd Monday of the month and we are a friendly bunch who do our best to make Freeland even better than it is already!

Inspired Villages

You have probably all received a leaflet produced and delivered by some residents about the Inspired Villages proposal to build 160 houses as part of a retirement village in Freeland on land near the nursing home. Unfortunately, at the time of submitting my notes for the Grapevine, the details on the informal public consultation were not available, and since being made available, the deadline for submitting comments is extremely tight (deadline was 12th March, although this was extended for another week). The proposals include a shop, gym and pool which would be available for community use. However, this site is not in the Local Plan as it was deemed unsuitable for development so it would need community support. Inspired Villages have not made an outline planning application to WODC as yet, so this is just in the informal consultation stage.

New shed on field

The new shed on the playing field is now nearly complete. Some additional work around the shed has been carried out to help with the drainage in this area. The landscaping work has also now been completed around the shed, and some landscaping work has also been carried out in the Broadmarsh Lane amenity area to tidy this up and make it more attractive. Various trees and shrubs have been planted including birch trees, hazel, hawthorn, apple trees, hornbeam and flowering pear.

Our thanks to Robert Crocker, Mary Ann Canning and Tim Webster who have all helped with this work, plus I would also like to pass on our thanks to Russell Fisher and the volunteers who assisted with the tree planting. Your help is much appreciated.

White lines around Oakland Close junction

The Parish Council approved the costs to have white lines painted around the junction of Oakland Close to mirror those on Parklands. This is in response to residents' concerns about ongoing parking issues at school drop off and pick-up times, especially as there is no pavement in Oakland Close and the road is very narrow at the entrance. This work will now be added to Highways schedule to be carried out sometime between April and October.

A CLIMATE CHANGE STRATEGY FOR WEST OXFORDSHIRE

At a meeting on 24th February, West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) approved a Climate Change Strategy for West Oxfordshire and a Sustainability Standards Checklist for Planning. They are the result of 18 months of work by multi-disciplinary officers and directed by a Climate Action Working Group comprising councillors from all parties.

The Strategy sets out five areas of focus: (i) Protecting and restoring natural ecosystems, (ii) Energy, (iii) Active travel and low-carbon transport, (iv) New development standards and (v) Education and engagement, and provides a framework for how the Council will achieve them over the next four years. The Council will report annually on progress made against the Strategy's objectives. A copy of the Climate Change Strategy can be found on the website (www.westoxon.gov.uk/environment/climate-action/climate-change-strategy) and residents wishing to find out more about what the Council is doing to address the climate emergency can subscribe to the Council's quarterly Climate Action Bulletin.

In November, Glasgow will welcome the UN's Climate Change Conference, COP-26, that was postponed from last November due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In preparation, we can expect a raft of climate-related policy announcements from around the world and it is good that the US President has appointed a Special Envoy for Climate to lead their efforts.

Turning now to the Sustainability Standards Checklist for Planning, this is a tool with which the Council, as the local planning authority, will seek to promote sustainability within the confines of the National Planning Policy Framework. Recognising that local action is required in response to a global issue, the Council now expects developers and applicants to adopt the highest possible standards of energy and sustainable design to ensure new developments in West Oxfordshire are designed as fit for the future. The Checklist shows separately standards expected of major and minor planning applications and a copy can be found on the website.

A national and local response to the Covid-19 global pandemic has further emphasised the cross benefits and inter-relationships between public health and the natural environment. The Council aims to capture the positive lessons learned; recognise the value our communities put on the natural environment and embed climate action as a foundation to our green recovery. To this end, achieving the highest environmental standards in all future development considerations has also been identified as a priority in the Council's Recovery Plan.



The newly refurbished Majors' area at the John Radcliffe, where patients who are seriously ill, but not in a life-threatening condition are treated, includes five up-graded assessment bays and a new assessment room. The Majors area at the Horton has been expanded with separate areas for adults and children. Four additional patient cubicles have also been added, including a dedicated infection control bay.

PROPOSED OXFORD-EYNSHAM-WITNEY-CARTERTON RAIL LINK



The Witney-Oxford Transport Group's new proposal for the Oxford-Eynsham-Witney-Carterton rail link has got cross party support. The County Council voted unanimously to consider undertaking a feasibility study for the plans. WOTG is about to submit the plans to request funds for the study from the Department for Transport's 'Restoring Your Railway Fund'.



OFFICIALS WAIT ON KEY DATE IN SALT CROSS PLANNING PROCEDURE

Planning officers at West Oxfordshire District Council are waiting to receive a date for a hearing into the draft Area Action Plan (AAP) for Salt Cross garden village.

The AAP was submitted last month along with the supporting viability assessment and will be considered by an appointed inspector from the Planning Inspectorate.

Details of the inspector's findings will be released once they are available.

FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

As there is still no prospect of our Gardening Club meeting for another few months, all we as a Club can do is to offer some advice on jobs in the garden that can be done at this time of year. Some of us think only of bulbs as the ones we plant in the autumn which flower the following spring like the thousands of daffodils planted by Garden Club members along Wroslyn Road. What a lovely welcome sight they are. Spring planted bulbs such as dahlias, lilies, nerines, and many others also offer a marvellous display. These can be planted in the ground or pots at this time of year.

The many hanging basket plants are now in the Garden Centres and these can be planted up and kept indoors till after the last frosts. Seeds can also be sown and pricked out ready to go in the ground towards the end of April or early May. If you don't grow seeds there are many ready plants for sale in Garden Centres to grow on or plant out in a few month's time. Try to buy or grow flowers that bloom at different times of the summer to give a continual display. Further pruning of spindly bits of rose bushes can be undertaken. Give the bushes a sprinkling of rose feed and mulch them with compost or manure. Fruit trees and bushes can be given a dose of Sulphate of Potash and a generous mulch around their roots.

Weeds are growing in profusion so either remove them or hoe them off before they start to flower. Many people have already started their veg planting of crops such as broad beans, onion sets, peas and many others, and the Garden Centres are getting in their veg plants. They sell out quite quickly so buy them as soon as you see them there.

Monty Don is advising us to not wage war on bugs in the garden but leave nature to balance these out even though there will be casualties. If your brassicas were eaten by white flies or cabbage white butterfly grubs, cover them with a very fine mesh to keep as many of these away from the plants. There are many ways of controlling slugs and snails other than slug pellets. He also advises leaving a section of your garden wild to encourage wildlife. Open flowers such as single dahlias and the many daisies are very good for bees, etc.

CONNECTING COMMUNITIES - FIRST AND LAST MILE COMMUNITY INTEREST COMPANY (CIC) - not for profit

Currently, there are four of us who make up First and Last Mile (F&LM). We feel that improved community transport services can be achieved by working with communities and residents to dovetail with existing commercial bus routes. We believe that residents being able to connect with the wider Oxfordshire community for health, education, industry/work and pleasure is a benefit for all. Our function at F&LM is to improve those connections.

Our approach is to work with local communities, local government and commercial bus companies to create an innovative positive synergy to achieve wider public transport services within Oxfordshire.

Since late November 2020 we have had discussions with both commercial bus companies and local government. We are looking at ways to bring about an affordable, inclusive and integrated service model to Oxfordshire's rural and suburban communities. We are hopeful that this proposed model will address the areas that are currently without service or not served adequately.

The Central Government's National Bus Strategy sets out a long-term investment of £3 billion for the renaissance for public bus & coach transport. The strategy recognises Community Transport as a key component of the necessary network connectivity.

Once set up, F&LM would encourage a community, with a service operating through their village, to take on the management and operation of that service. F&LM would be available with support and assistance. We hope each community will want to have ownership at some level.

We hope Community/Commercial public transport could be one solution to improve connections, reduce isolation and car dependency. To bring long term success to this Community Transport Enterprise, First and Last Mile need volunteers.

F&LM's proposal is for its first service to be Standlake to Long Hanborough Rail Station via Stanton Harcourt, Sutton, Eynsham and Freeland, diverting occasionally to Northmoor and Babcock Hythe through the day.

There is some way to go, and we want communities to join in the journey. Our mantra is 'Not the passenger to the bus, but the bus to the passenger' how we get there will take time, but the delivery of a reliable, comfortable, affordable and appropriate service is achievable.


