

Letter from our Rector, Rev. Steve Stewart:

I've been reading and studying the Bible for well over 40 years now, and it has enriched my life beyond measure. One of the things I love about the Bible is that, quite simply, it tells us what God is like – and what God likes.

In the years before I picked up my Bible, I assumed a lot of things about God that turned out to be wrong. I thought for example that God was far too busy to be interested in me. I thought God was only there for my emergencies, rather than to prevent most of my emergencies! And I thought God was mostly interested in telling us off and preventing us from having fun. I couldn't have been more wrong.

So, as the saying goes, "imagine my surprise" when I picked up my Bible, began to read, and discovered things like "God sets the lonely in families" in Psalm 68:6, "the LORD your God loves you" from the book of Deuteronomy, and learning from the book of Revelation that God offers eternal life as a free gift! The Bible has got a lot of surprises – and the biggest one of all is perhaps that God loves us so much that he sent his son Jesus Christ, even when you and I were still sinners, to die so that by faith in him we might become God's children in eternity!





King's Coronation

The Parish Council is completely deluged at the moment with the proposed speculative housing developments in the village among other things. However, we did hold an open meeting on 3rd March, which was advertised in the Grapevine last month and on Facebook, to which a number of residents came to discuss how we improve sustainability and social opportunities in the village. While a number of great ideas were proposed, no one attending felt they had the capacity to help arrange anything for the Coronation. However, we would be very happy if Freeland could celebrate in some way, so have since asked around to see whether a group would be willing to organise a fun run, and have approached the pub to see what their plans are. Inspired Villages

We've learned that Inspired Villages has lodged a High Court challenge against the dismissal of its appeal in January by the Planning Inspectorate. This was concerning its proposal to build 160 retirement units on the estate parklands west of Wroslyn Road.

A High Court challenge is a legal challenge to the appeal decision, and not a rerun of the merits of the planning arguments. A challenge must have legal grounds, such as claims that the Planning Inspector misapplied the law or policy, or failed to follow proper procedures. If the challenge is successful, the Planning Inspectorate will have to re-determine the original appeal.

The Planning Inspectorate has explained to us what happens next:

- Inspired Villages' claim will first be considered by the Judge based on written submissions.
- If permission is refused, Inspired Villages has the right to apply for an oral hearing. If permission is again refused, Inspired Villages can take this to the Court of Appeal. If the Court of Appeal also refuses permission for the case to proceed, there is no other route for Inspired Villages to take this forward.
- If permission is granted, the claim will proceed to a hearing, the outcome of which can be challenged by the losing party in the Court of Appeal. Claims can go all the way to the Supreme Court.
- Typically, there are a few months between each stage of the process, sometimes much longer.

Clearly, this is very disappointing news and it looks like this whole process might end up taking some time. We will keep you posted as and when we hear more. *Continued*...



PHOTO ID REQUIRED FOR ELECTIONS FROM 4th MAY

Residents in West Oxfordshire District will need to show photographic ID to vote in person at this year's local elections which are being held on **Thursday 4th May**.

Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK, EEA or Commonwealth drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo and the name on the ID should be the same name as appears on the Electoral Register.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free ID online at **www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate** or by completing a paper form which is available from West Oxfordshire District Council at the Woodgreen office. If you need any help with applying for the free ID, or want to request an application form, contact the electoral services team on **01993 861410**.

More information is available on the West Oxfordshire District Council website (**www.westoxon.gov.uk**), including details of how to apply for the free ID. Anyone not able to visit the Council website, or apply for a Voter Authority Certificate online, is being encouraged to contact the Council as soon as possible and no later than the **5pm** deadline on **Wednesday 25 April**.

Anyone who wants to have their say in the elections this May must also be registered to vote. If you aren't already registered it only takes five minutes to register online at **www.gov.uk/register-to-vote**. Voters wishing to apply to their council for free ID should first make sure they are registered to vote.

The changes do not affect postal votes but do affect proxy voters who will be required to show their own valid ID when voting on behalf of someone else.

FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

The meeting of the Club at the end of February was a talk entitled 'Medicinal Herbs' given by Caroline Sheldrick and what an interesting talk it was. She divided her talk into three parts.

I) Culinary Herbs.

The herbs can be used green or dried and steeped in oil, alcohol or warm water. Thyme is anti-bacterial and anti-fungal because it affects tissues. Fennel seeds can sooth the digestion as in gripewater. It also has minerals and vitamins. Hyssop is an expectorant and good to put on bruises. Mint has menthol so is good for colds and flu. It is also anti-bacterial and anti-fungal. Mint oils are good for digestive ulcers and coughing. Lavender is calming and good for burns. Sage is very strong so a little in warm water can be used to gargle.

2) Ornamental Plants.

Lemon Balm is anti viral so rub leaves between hands and put on cold sores. Echinacea stimulates the nervous system and is also anti-bacterial and anti-viral. Good for tonsillitis and to use as a preventative before flying. Pot Marigolds dried flowers use for dry infections and is anti-viral. Elderflower cordial is good for colds and flu and is a mild laxative.

3) Wild Plants.

Dandelion tonic stimulates the liver and insulin prodution. Stinging Nettle early leaves are a mineral to use against eczema and kidney stones and hayfever. Comfrey knits bones and blood vessels after a break. Whether any of us will be brave enough to try some of these remedies remains to be seen!

The meeting on **Monday 27th March at 7.30pm** in Freeland Hall is a talk by a new speaker Joff Elphick entitled 'Crayfish on the Lawn'. What it is all about we will have to wait to find out!

CYCLING/WALKING PATH ALONG LOWER ROAD IS BACK IN SALT CROSS AREA ACTION PLAN

I am delighted to report that following the recent public consultation, the government inspectors have brought back a requirement for a segregated cycling and walking path between Eynsham roundabout and Hanborough Station.

What does this mean in practice?

The inspector clarified that (verbatim): "For the part of the cycleway and pedestrian link within the Salt Cross boundary will be delivered directly by the developers of the Salt Cross site.

For the part of the cycleway and pedestrian link outside of the Salt Cross boundary will be delivered directly by Oxfordshire County Council Highways/Transport, but the developers have to make a financial contribution to this delivery in the Section 106 planning agreement"

The OCC Highways/Transport are working on achieving designs for this section. This is a great result and we owe it to the many local residents, who responded passionately to the consultation and to all signatories of the petitions asking to improve travel conditions on Lower Road.

Join Green TEA and members of Low Carbon Hub Project LEO (Local Energy Oxfordshire) *Smart and Fair Futures* team, to find out about the opportunities, how to get involved and the support available at an open meeting on **Wednesday 26th April 7.30 pm** at Eynsham Village Hall (small hall), Back Lane. Refreshments from **7pm**. Parking and EV chargers nearby.

Climate change, with the linked biodiversity crisis, is the most serious challenge we face. We hear a lot about reducing carbon emissions to 'net zero' by 2050 but we need to take radical action now and over the next few years if we are to keep a habitable planet.

It can seem a bit overwhelming but as part of Project LEO, a team from Low Carbon Hub and Green TEA have been working hard over the last few years on developing a local action plan for a clean, green future with zero carbon emissions and we are ready to tell you what we have found. If we make changes now - from saving energy, changing the way we travel and heat our buildings to producing our share of renewable energy we can have an energy system that will be fairer to people and to the planet we rely on.

Who is the Community Action Plan for? The Smart and Fair Futures project has developed a Community Action Plan for Zero Carbon Energy for the area served by our local electricity substation. This includes all of Freeland parish (you are the only parish entirely in the project area!), most of Eynsham parish and parts of Hanborough, North Leigh, South Leigh, Cassington, Stanton Harcourt and Cumnor parishes. It was developed by the Low Carbon Hub with and GreenTEA, with help from West Oxfordshire District Council and some of our Parish Councillors. It is part of Project LEO (Local Energy Oxfordshire), a national innovation project. It is the first of its kind and will help other areas develop their own plans.

ANIMALS INJURED ON THE ROAD

I'm sure we've all, at one time or another, come across the consequence of an animal coming into contact with a motor vehicle. Unfortunately, sometimes the animal can be left seriously injured and requiring attention. If you were to come across such a situation, how would you react? Would you know what to do? Who to call?

Well, some friends found themselves in just such a situation recently on Wroslyn Road with a Muntjac in distress and requiring urgent attention. Thoughts turned to what could be done to alleviate the animal of its suffering and they were eventually put in contact with **Tiggywinkles Wildlife Hospital** in Haddenham (**01844 290494 or 01844 292292**) which is a wildlife hospital dedicated to rescuing and rehabilitating all British wild animals. They are available to offer help and where necessary attend to animals in distress **24/7** which they did in this situation. In this particular incident by the time they arrived the Muntjac had succumbed to its injuries.

I'll be the first to admit that I'd never heard of Tiggywinkles Wildlife Hospital until this incident was brought to my attention, but I've now got their number on speed dial on my phone. Based just outside of Thame they have a Visitor Centre which is open all year round, check the website for exact times. For those of you who want to give a special present to any animal loving family members they also offer Wildlife Keeper Experience Days, virtual gifts and much more. They don't receive government or lottery funding sadly, so they rely on legacies and donations from the public and there are links on the website to various fund-raising schemes from simple donations to sponsoring animals to volunteering.

FULL CLOSURE OF BOTLEY ROAD, OXFORD AT THE RAILWAY BRIDGE FROM TUESDAY 11th APRIL to end of OCTOBER 2023

As you may have read in the local press, as part of the associated works involved in replacing the railway bridge that goes over the Botley Road, beside Oxford Rail Station, there will be no access for any vehicles under the railway bridge in either direction. Access will only be available for pedestrians, wheelchairs and cyclists.

Eastbound buses on the Botley Road will drop off at the stop beside Osney Island and passengers will then need to walk the rest of the way to the Rail Station concourse or Frideswide Square for onwards transport.

The reverse will happen if you are intending to travel westwards along the Botley Road.

At the time of writing, neither Stagecoach nor Oxford Bus Company have clarified exactly how this will work.

Additionally, Oxford Rail Station will be closed to trains from **Saturday 29th July to Sunday 6th August** for track work and prep work for a new platform.

Further complete closures will be taking place between March and October 2024 for highway work, bridge demolition and replacement.




