Letter from our Rector, Rev Steve Stewart:

just for starters

Every guest who appears on the Radio 4 show "Desert Island Discs" is given a copy of the Bible to take to their imaginary island. It's not just because we are a "Christian country", but actually because it is a truly incredible book.

The Bible is the written bedrock of the Christian faith. Through the Bible, God reveals not only the things which are good for us – and not good for us – but also his love for us. The Bible reveals to us the meaning of life, indeed what it means to be human and to lead a life full of purpose not just now but into all eternity.

The Bible is where we learn about Jesus – not just historical facts about his life and death, but the meaning for us of his life, death and resurrection. It is an incredible book. We think the Bible is worth looking at and getting to know and understand. It is not human beings' words about God, but God's word about human beings.

And so, beginning on Sunday 21st April at 4pm and for 7 weeks, Hanborough and Freeland churches will be running a series of sessions called "Just for Starters" (J4S).

There is no knowledge or expertise whatsoever required to come along to "Just for Starters". All we will do each week, in a relaxed and friendly environment, is have a look together at a couple of Bible verses and chat together about what they mean: what they tell us about God and what they tell us about ourselves.

Maybe you are somebody who knows nothing whatsoever about Christianity: you are extremely welcome to join us! Maybe you are somebody who knows a little but would like to understand a bit more: you also are extremely welcome. Or perhaps you have been a Christian for a while and would just enjoy looking at the Bible: you too are extremely welcome. Nobody will be expected to pray. Nobody will be made to do, or think, or believe anything.

For one hour, over tea, coffee and (hopefully!) cake, me and my colleague Rev. Heather McCulloch (our curate) will simply open the Bible, take a look at what it says and chat through it with the group in a relaxed, safe and informal environment. Everyone who comes along will be given a little booklet which is just to help us ask questions – and keep us on track!







Green tip

The climate crisis has resulted in a string of records being broken over the past years, and February 2024 was no different. Even before the month had finished, the Met Office predicted that February 2024 will be the UK's hottest, and wettest, February on record. In the final reckoning last month was the world's warmest February in modern times, extending the run of monthly records to nine in a row. Given these extreme climate events, it is perhaps not surprising that a recent survey of nearly 130,000 people in 125 countries found "almost universal" support (86%) for climate action.

When thinking about what part we can play in protecting the planet it is perhaps worth remembering an ancient quote: 'We do not inherit the earth from our ancestors; we borrow it from our children'. Reflecting this quote, this is an invitation to start imagining what sort of planet we would like to leave for future generations. We are very good at focusing on dystopian futures, but for a change let us imagine a better place. If we cannot imagine a better future, then what chance do we have of creating it? Perhaps at home with your family, or at work with your friends, let's talk about the positive future we would like to see in the world. We must never forget the power of words and stories to change attitudes and outcomes.

Botley West Solar Farm

We have submitted our comments on the Adequacy of Consultation to WODC. In summary we argued that the documentation provided was not easily interpretable and did not convey the vast scale of this project in any way. There was no public event in Freeland and it would not have been easy, due to bus timetables, for residents without a car to attend the other nearby venues (Long Hanborough, Eynsham and Cassington). The timing of the events (mainly on weekday afternoons) limited options for working people or those with young families to attend.

The next step is for West Oxfordshire to submit their report on the Adequacy of Consultation to the Planning Inspectorate and if it is not considered adequate, there is the small possibility that the developers will have to re-do the Consultation. YOUR COUNCIL TAX BILL EXPLAINED

Dear residents.

You should have received your new Council Tax Bills by now. West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) sends these out as the collection agency, but most of the funds go to Oxfordshire County Council (OCC), Thames Valley Police Authority (TVPA) and Freeland Parish Council (FPC). Band D is the benchmark for comparison; e.g., the charge for Band A is one-third less while that for Band H is double. In Freeland the tax for Band D will be £2,315.60 shared as follows: OCC 78.6%, TVPA 11.6%, WODC 5.4% and FPC 4.4%. The increase on the past year is £109.40 or 5% and this comprises £86.50 to OCC, £13 to TVPA and £5 to WODC.

FPC has increased its tax by 5% to £101.40 having set a Precept of £72,000; a rise of £3,131 over the previous year. About 40% of the Precept will go towards the Village Hall loan repayment and the rest for maintaining village facilities and other overheads. The last instalment of the loan repayment is due in 2035. You will be able to find out more at the Annual Parish Meeting on Friday 10th May.

WODC's budget for the coming year allows for an increase of around one million in the cost of services to £16.8 million because of inflation, restructuring the bureaucracy and growth in non-core projects. There was already a big increase in the previous year's budget due to pay inflation and higher energy prices. The budget is just about balanced but only because of a one-off accounting adjustment from the past year and increases in fees and charges, including another £5 rise in the green waste license which now stands at £50. The Council's financial resilience is likely to weaken unless the administration gets a grip on costs or it receives more government funding going forward.

I am particularly concerned about OCC's finances. Statutory Adult Social Care and Children's Social Care and Education (after government grants) account for more than 70% of spending. Although the government has provided a last-minute funding settlement to enable OCC to balance its budget, this was contingent on a 5% increase in its share of the tax (which is the maximum allowed without a referendum or special dispensation) and followed hikes in fees and charges. Yet, funding for key services remains severely constrained and spread very thinly on highways, public health, waste disposal, fire, libraries, etc.

So, you would be forgiven for feeling over-taxed and under-served. This leads me nicely to representation. Local elections will be held on **Thursday 2nd May** for my seat on the district council, the Police and Crime Commissioner and the parish council if it is contested. And please remember to take a valid ID with you to the polling station. Yes, really!

(littlefreelibrary.org) there are more than 175,000 Little Free Libraries across 121 countries around the world, and to date, an estimated 400 million books have been shared.

That incredibly high number makes it difficult to

picture just how many books that is, but there is one author that has sold over 400 million books, all by himself! Do you know who it is? (The answer is at the end of this article).

Thank you as always for giving and taking books in equal measure. That's how the Little Free Library works: take as many books as you like and give some when you can. This means that there is a constant rotation of different books coming and going. You never know what you'll find!

We've had a few occasions recently when people have left cardboard boxes of books by the Little Free Library. Please don't do this: donated books should be either left inside the Little Free Library if there's space on the shelves, or else put inside the donation boxes. These boxes can be found behind the bus shelter (in front of the village hall) or in the box next to the small Little Free Library outside 138 Wroslyn Road. Thank you for your understanding.

So, who is the author that's sold over 400 million books?

The answer is: James Patterson. He's a very prolific writer, and there's usually at least one of his books in the Little Free Library at any given time!



Thursday I Ith April: "The Hay Wain: an in-depth look at a familiar masterpiece" - Timothy Wilcox

No English painting could be more familiar than Constable's The Hay Wain. But what does it actually represent? What is it about? Painted in 1821 as the third of the series of great six-foot landscapes based on scenes of the Stour Valley on the Suffolk-Essex border, it undoubtedly shows Constable at the very height of his powers. There is much more to it, though, than a vivid recollection of a beautiful summer's day. As well as studying the picture physically, through sketches, x-rays, and accounts of its painting (and repainting), the lecture reflects on how Constable used poetry and the work of historic and contemporary artists to build a richly suggestive atmosphere into this homely rural episode.

Thursday 9th May: "The classical re-invented: the brilliant legacy of Sir Christopher Wren" - Ian Swankie

In this talk, Ian winds the clock back to the seventeenth century with an armchair tour of some of Wren's magnificent structures including City Churches, the Old Royal Naval College at Greenwich and, of course, his greatest masterpiece St Paul's Cathedral. CHANGES TO THE STAGECOACH S7 BUS TIMETABLE

Stagecoach made some relatively minor timing changes, for reliability purposes, to the **S7** bus route from **Sunday I 0th March**, with the major change being that the service is withdrawn from Woodstock in the very early mornings and in the evenings. They've made this decision because turning buses in Woodstock market place was opposed by local residents and traders and there was an incident resulting in an alternative being required, which was not cost-effective and involved using the turning area at Wootton (north of Woodstock).



The Group has formally joined the Low Carbon Hub. What does this mean? Low Carbon Hub describe themselves on their website (www.lowcarbonhub.org/) as being 'at the heart of a collective effort to catalyse a low carbon economy in Oxfordshire, both through powering down to decrease energy demand and through powering up to increase renewable energy supply'. How does Freeland Energy Group fit in, I can hear you thinking?

Maybe you will recall that our members carried out the house thermal imaging project this winter? That was a first step in bringing awareness to decreasing energy demand by alerting householders to where there may be heat leaks from their homes. The outcome from this session was that we wondered that perhaps householders who had already taken first steps in better insulation and more aware were the people who requested the thermal imaging? Our volunteers may even be a little disappointed they did not get any major glowing light shows on those cold night missions, but they do expect to take out the camera again next winter.

If you are someone who has already introduced clean energy into your home through solar panels, heat pumps or changed to an electric car, for example, how did you sift through the sales pitches, what actually was involved in fitting panels? Could you help someone else by sharing your experience, help demistify the technology? Would you be prepared to be on a list of contacts if someone needed to better understand the processes involved? If you are interested in supporting this idea with practical insight please contact Colin on the contact details below.

The Community Action Plan for Zero-Carbon Energy (CAPZero) is central to the Low Carbon Hub and has now been published (see website above). The plan sets out targets to 2030 for business, households, transport and local energy generation in Eynsham, Hanborough, Freeland and other local Parishes, served by the Cuckoo Lane sub-station. Freeland Parish Council will be represented on the Steering Group for this Project and the Freeland Energy Group will be supporting home and business owners who wish to reduce their energy costs and move to renewable energy. CHANGES TO LANDLINE TELEPHONES

The UK's telephone network is being upgraded, which means that landline services are changing. You can still have a landline in your home, but the technology that powers it will be different. For most, switching over will be straightforward, but some people may need new equipment or support to make the changes. The following guidance is taken from information provided by Age UK.

What is changing?

Landlines have been delivered through an analogue network for decades, but this is being replaced with newer digital technology.

The new system is called 'Voice over Internet Protocol' (VoIP). You may also hear this referred to as a digital landline or 'Digital Voice', the name of BT's new home phone service. BT is one of many network providers making this change.

Once you've moved to the new digital system, your landline will mainly work as it always has, although there will be some differences. For example, it won't work if there's a power cut so you'll need an alternative solution such as a mobile phone or battery backup unit for emergency calls (but we have more information about this below).

What is digital landline? Will I need an internet connection to make phone calls?

Digital landlines use an internet connection to make and receive calls. Given this, you'll need an internet connection at home to use the new landline digital system. If you already have a broadband connection, then the new digital landline system will use this. But don't worry - if you don't have broadband, your network provider, such as BT and Virgin Media O2, will supply you with a connection to support the new digital landline system. You shouldn't pay extra for this if you don't choose to take up a broadband service.

Throughout this page, we'll be talking about broadband and broadband companies or services. When we say 'broadband', we just mean a high-speed internet connection.

Why are these changes happening?

The current analogue landline network needs to be replaced because it's old and is becoming difficult to maintain. The new digital landlines use the internet to make phone calls – this offers better quality calls as well as some additional features such as protection from scams.

UK phone and broadband companies are leading this change and are working with Ofcom, the Government and others. The aim of Ofcom (the communications regulator) is to make sure customers don't face unnecessary disruption or harm because of the changes.

When are these changes happening?

The changeover has already started, and some people have already been moved to the digital system.

This is an industry-wide change, but timescales may differ depending on your service provider. However, for most networks, the move to digital landlines will happen by December 2025.

Providers will contact their customers ahead of the change to let them know when they'll be making the switch to a digital landline.

BT, for example, is rolling out its programme on a region-by-region basis. However, in general, they aren't currently switching certain groups, as long as they're aware of people's circumstances. The groups who aren't currently being invited to switch are:

- people aged 75 and over
- people who have disclosed any additional needs
- people who only have a landline (and not broadband)
- people with telecare alarms
- people with no mobile signal at home.

Originally, BT weren't contacting people aged 70-74, but they're now inviting a limited number of people in this age group to switch as part of a new trial. These will be people living in urban areas with broadband and a good mobile signal.

In some areas, changes to the network will mean that everyone will be contacted about moving to the digital system. You may also be moved to the new system if you decide to move to a new phone and broadband package.

Other companies have also started rolling out digital systems, and this may include all customers.

Whoever your telephone provider is, make sure they're aware if you have a telecare alarm or if you may need additional support.

What happens when I change to the digital system?

Your telephone provider will contact you in advance to let you know when your system's changing and what you need to do. In some cases, an engineer will need to visit to make changes.

For the majority of people, the change will be straightforward. If you already have a broadband connection, you may just need to plug your phone into your broadband router or you'll be sent an adapter that connects to your phone and plugs into your router. If you have more than one phone socket with separate handsets, you may need additional adapters.

When you're contacted by your provider let them know if you have any questions or concerns about moving to the digital service, or if you need any additional help. Although everyone will need to move to the digital system at some point, you may be able to delay this if you're not ready to switch.

Can I keep my phone number?

Yes, in most cases you'll be able to keep your current phone number.

Will I need a new phone?

Nearly all existing handsets will work with the new system. But if you do need to change your handset, your phone provider will be able to advise you on this.

Will anything else be affected, like my telecare?

The switch to digital landlines may affect telecare devices and other equipment such as personal alarms and security alarms if they're connected to your phone line. You should contact your device supplier to check if your device will work with the new system or whether any equipment will need to be upgraded.

Although your landline telephone provider will contact you before the switch takes place, you may want to let them know about any telecare devices that you have in advance.

If you're buying a new device that's linked to the phone system, you should also check with the seller or manufacturer that this will be compatible.

Will my new phone contract be more expensive?

For BT customers, there's no difference in price for its Digital Voice home phone product. Virgin Media has also said that people won't pay more than what they already pay for their current service.

This means that you shouldn't face extra costs if you need a new simple internet connection to make calls.

What happens if there's a power cut?

Unlike some traditional corded analogue phones, a digital phone will only work in a power cut if it has a battery back-up, because it normally uses your home electricity. In these instances, phone companies are advising people to use mobile phones as a backup.

If you're dependent on your landline phone - for example, if you don't have a mobile phone or you live somewhere where there's no or poor mobile signal, then your telephone provider must offer you a **'resilience solution'** to make sure you can make emergency calls during a power cut. This could be a mobile phone (if you have mobile signal) or a battery-backup unit that connects to your landline phone and provides power in case of a power outage.

This resilience solution should be provided free of charge to people who are dependent on their landline. If you're not eligible for a free resilience solution, you may be able to purchase one from your provider or another retailer - talk to your provider about the options available to you.

Is there anything else I should watch out for?

As the switchover is affecting millions of homes, this can create an opportunity for criminals to develop new scams. These scam attempts could happen over the phone, via email, or in person on your doorstep.

Remember the following scam advice when someone's contacting you about the switchover:

STOP – take a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or your personal information.

CHALLENGE – could it be fake? It's OK to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. You should never feel rushed or pressured into making a decision.

PROTECT – contact your bank immediately if you think you've been a victim of a scam and report it to Action Fraud by calling **0300 123 2040.**

Other unscrupulous people may also try to sell you equipment or get you to sign up to expensive contracts that you don't need. In these cases, it's important that you don't rush into making any decisions. You can always seek a second opinion and speak to your phone company – they should be able to advise you about what you need.
