is open for private prayer seven days a week from 9am to 5pm.



Letter from our Rector, Rev. Steve Stewart:



According to the latest announcement from the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, a momentous day is coming for the churches: that after 19th July 2021, all legal restrictions on communal singing in churches will be lifted!

This marks a momentous change for our churches of Hanborough and Freeland – St Peter and St Paul Church Hanborough, St Mary the Virgin Freeland, and Christ Church Long Hanborough – where once again we will sing hymns and songs after a break of some 16 months. I've almost forgotten what us all singing together in church feels like, but I still can't wait to experience it once again.

As a child of the 1960s, brought up on the music of a somewhat golden age of pop and rock, a musician schooled in the likes of The Beatles, The Rolling Stones, Dylan, Hendrix, Clapton and many, many more, music is part of my DNA. But it was really only when I began to use my musical gifts as a worship leader in church – which of course where so many of the greats traditionally developed and honed their skills, with even John Lennon and Paul McCartney meeting at a church fête! – that I think I truly appreciated what God has given us in music, and how using it for his praise and glory is a wonderful thing for us to be able to do.

We would love to welcome you to our churches as we begin this next stage of new things following lockdown, and which now include singing at Hanborough and Freeland. There are **10am** services each week at each of the three churches and a space for everyone – especially if we see an end to social distancing, LOL!

And if after the service, you just want to chat to me about great music, sacred or secular, I would love to do that with you.

At the June meeting, the Parish Council approved the co-option of three new members to the Parish Council – these were: Andrew Bird, Andy Bain and Tony Tomkys.

I would like to extend a very warm welcome to them and hope they will enjoy their new role! All three of them live in the village and bring a variety of skills and knowledge to the Council.

This means we now are in the fortunate position of having a full Council with eight Councillors in post. Contact details have been updated on the village website and on the village noticeboard.

Gigaclear works in Freeland - update

These works will be continuing in the village and the latest information I have is below:

Wheelie Bins & recycling boxes

May I politely remind everyone to please ensure their wheelie bins and recycling boxes are removed from the pavement and returned to their respective properties as soon as possible after a rubbish collection. Wheelie bins left on a pavement are not only an eyesore but also obstruct the public footpaths and highways, which is a public offence. Furthermore, if a member of the public injures themselves as a result of a wheelie bin left on a pavement, the owners of the bin are liable. Please help to keep the village looking smart and tidy and keep the pavements safe for all our residents to enjoy. Your cooperation with this matter is much appreciated.

Improved Mobile Phone Signal

The Parish Council are still looking at ways to improve the mobile phone signal in the village and a location at the top end of Wroslyn Road has been identified as a possible option and this is being explored further. I will keep you updated with any progress.





FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

It is unlikely that the Club will reopen until our AGM in October, but if rules about meetings change for the better, our speakers are all ready to come when it is allowed. We haven't tried to have Zoom meetings as some clubs have done, so keep on gardening and doing what we are allowed to do.

Because Ray and Jill Evans have moved away we wanted 2 more people to join the Committee and it is very good news that Alison Faulkner has agreed to do so. Welcome Alison, we look forward to your contribution at our very friendly committee meetings. Tod Fairfield has also offered to help with ordering speakers and outings etc, so welcome to Tod as well. Just a few things to get on with in the garden...

Two of the main tasks are to keep on top of the weeds and hoe them off before they flower. The other task is to keep mowing if you have a lawn.

Water any new trees or bushes and mulch around them to keep the moisture in, particularly if it gets very hot and dry. Thin out apples etc if there are more than about 2 fruits growing together. In our garden, July is the picking month as the soft fruit ripens. Protect these from the birds.

Hardy annuals can be planted from seed ready for next year. Deadhead roses regularly as well as flowers such as cosmos, daisies, etc to prolong their flowering and water and feed when necessary. Pick sweetpeas frequently. Watch out for the little red beetles on lilies and destroy them as soon as possible - if you can catch them!

In the veg garden, water and feed tomatoes regularly and pick off the side shoots. Sew seeds such as lettuce little and often. Support pea plants. Spray blackfly on broadbeans with weak washing up liquid and pick the pods when young. Lift early potatoes before the little slugs get at them! Save as much rain water as possible in tanks attached to a drainpipes. Washing up water can also be used on plants.

Repot house plants and put most of them outside where possible. Watch out for signs of vine weevil in pots, the c shaped white grubs that eat the roots of plants causing them to wither and possibly die. Turn the pot out and destroy any you find and repot plant with fresh compost.

I know most gardeners are familiar with a lot of what I have written but maybe new gardeners may find a few suggestions helpful!

BEFSA UPDATE

As we in the UK come out of our current Covid restrictions and our life picks up as we enjoy greater freedoms, South Africa is facing a massive third wave of infections. BEFSA was helping to feed 1800 children a day during the second wave and is braced to do the same now. The schools are closing



early for the winter holidays which means again many children not getting enough food to eat, as their main meal would have been eaten at school. It was also noted that more and more adults who were desperate to find food, were arriving at BEFSA supported feeding stations, as they know that our small charity has worked so closely with the schools in the Eastern Cape areas of Adelaide, Fort Beaufort and beyond.

Having been unable to run our normal fundraising events this year, our funds are low, so we are currently only able to commit to helping the feeding station in one town - Adelaide. Here we have trustees of BEFSA in situ to oversee the joint work between schools and the large Methodist church, which will act as the feeding station hub. It takes just **£25** to feed a school full of children for a week and we are currently planning to continue the programme until the winter. Targeting our help in this way has been a really hard decision for the trustees in the UK, but we cannot make promises we may not be able to keep as the pandemic continues to hit the poorest areas in the world hardest.



The app is available on Google Play and the App Store. It forms part of the Council's work to build a vibrant economy, create healthy towns and villages and support strong local communities.

Funding for the project will be coming from the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) as part of its Welcome Back Fund.

WYCHWOOD FOREST FAIR

The annual Wychwood Forest Fair will go ahead this year on **Sunday 22nd August** at Foxburrow Wood, Witney from **11am – 5pm**.



Celebrating West Oxfordshire's rural traditions, conservation work and heritage, the Fair highlights rural activities and arts and crafts while raising money for conservation charity the Wychwood Forest Trust, formerly known as the Wychwood Project. This year's family-friendly event will include pony rides, falconry, ferret racing, rural crafts displays and arts and crafts, along with a bar and live music area.

Foxburrow Wood, this year's venue, was purchased using proceeds from previous Forest Fairs. Today the community wood is progressing well in its transformation from agricultural field into thriving nature reserve.

Same charity, new name

In July 2021, a decade after merging with the Friends of Wychwood to form an independent charity, the Wychwood Project changed its name to the Wychwood Forest Trust. Developing a new website in-house and working with local designers GD Associates to update their logo for an extremely charitable rate, the charity hopes their change of name marks a positive new phase for nature conservation in the historic Wychwood area.

A historic Fair

Founded in 1796 by three Methodists living in Finstock, the Wychwood Forest Fair has a long history.

Intended as a calmer counterpart to the annual Witney Feast, as the Fair grew in reputation and scale it transformed into a raucous event, aided by a legal quirk meaning it operated outside parish jurisdiction.

Following a spate of rowdy incidents in the 1830s, the Fair was condemned and prohibited. And once the 1853 Parliamentary Act of Disafforestation placed the historic Wychwood Forest under private ownership, the Fair was banned for good.

The Wychwood Forest Trust revived the Forest Fair in 2000 to celebrate the rural traditions, arts and crafts, and conservation work taking place in the area historically part of the Wycwhood Forest -120 square miles of today's West Oxfordshire. The modern fair is a peaceful, family-friendly event that looks back to its 18th-century origins.

The Fair in 2021

To keep the event safe, this year's Fair will be more open air than previous years. Large, closed marquees will be replaced with open-air gazebos and tents, and visitors will have more space than usual to spread out. The Wychwood Forest Fair is also encouraging advanced bookings to help monitor numbers: tickets purchased in advance cost **£8**, but on the day cost **£10**. Under-16s are free.

TIMELY REMINDER

The COVID-19 vaccination programme is open to anyone aged 18 and over. There are currently two vaccines being used locally in Oxfordshire:

- Pfizer/BioNTech
- Oxford/AstraZeneca

The vaccines are allocated nationally and local centres do not have any influence over which they receive. You cannot choose which vaccine you have. When you book, you'll only be offered appointments for vaccines that are suitable for you.

Most people can have any of the COVID-19 vaccines, but some people are only offered certain vaccines. For example, if you're pregnant or under 40 you'll usually only be offered appointments for the Pfizer/BioNTech or Moderna vaccines.

You should have the same vaccine for both doses unless you had serious side effects (such as a severe allergic reaction) after your 1st dose. These are very rare reactions and if affected, you will be informed by your GP or hospital clinician, that a different vaccine is necessary for your second dose. Minor side effects after having any of the vaccinations are common and not a cause for concern. These are usually mild and should not last longer than a week.

They include:

- a sore arm from the injection
- feeling tired
- a headache
- feeling achy

Oxford University Hospitals - Update

(John Radcliffe; Churchill; Nuffield Orthopaedic; Horton)

We thought that it might be a good time for a Covid-19 update following the Oxford University Hospitals Council of Governors Meeting on 14 July.

Top news: there is more Covid about in our area but cases are usually mild.

To put a bit more detail around what is happening here, you'll be aware from the news that Oxford has become a bit of a hotspot for new Covid-19 cases, almost all of the delta variant, and this is beginning to spread across the county. As a result, our area has qualified for extra government funding to ensure that testing is widely available.

It is important to get a free test if you think you might have been in contact with an infected person. Just Google 'Covid testing in Oxfordshire' to find your nearest walk-in centre. If you test positive you must self-isolate.

It continues to make sense to adhere to the 'Hands, Face, Space' advice. Washing your hands is a great way to stop the spread of infection.

Covid-19 vaccination is highly effective and safe, posing a substantially lower risk than the complications of infection so please make sure that you are fully vaccinated. In the event that you haven't had one or both jabs don't wait to be called. Go onto the NHS website and book in.

Cases in Oxfordshire have mainly affected younger, unvaccinated people and not required hospital intervention. For that reason these hospitals went for a considerable time with no Oxfordshire hospital admissions for Covid-19. This is now starting to pick up a bit and at the time of writing some five people per day were presenting in the Emergency Department. Of those about two per day were requiring hospital admission. Happily no-one was at that time on a ventilator.

The hospitals and staff are coping very well and there has been no significant new impact on elective procedures, although it will be a considerable time before the backlogs are eliminated. They do vary a lot between specialties and you may find yourself being referred to another specialist centre for treatment in some areas, such as ophthalmology. There is no shortage of tests and PPE, and all hospital staff receive twice-weekly lateral flow tests.

The government announced relaxations of the COVID-19 rules in England from Monday 19 July, but we want to make you aware that this relaxation does not apply to our hospital sites where, to keep ourselves and our patients safe, we must not relax our guard.

We wish to remind you that the guidance in our hospitals has not changed and that mask wearing and social distancing remain in place on all our hospital sites.


