





Bench on The Green

The replacement bench has arrived and will be installed shortly. Our thanks to Parish Councillor Andy Bain for disposing of the old bench and installing the new one, and thanks again also to the Teddy Girls for raising the funds to enable this to be purchased.

Bins!

Many of you will have noticed the bins around the village being upgraded from separate litter and dog waste bins to new dual bins which can be used for both. This is a project being rolled out across the District by WODC.

However, for the past 2 weeks the new style litter bin at the entrance to the village hall car park has been overflowing with litter, way before it is due to be emptied.

When I reported it to WODC they informed me that on both occasions, it has contained a blockage due to folders, hard backed books and a large piece of wood being placed in the bin, therefore restricting its capacity. This week there was a large piece of cardboard, again, restricting the bin's capacity and which could have been recycled! It's not clear if the books have come from the little library nearby, but please can I ask that any large items such as wood, books, files, folders, cardboard etc are not placed in these bins but taken home for recycling or if books please donate them to the library! Thanks!



Toddler Play Area upgrade

Following on from last month's report, it has been highlighted in the recent annual play area inspection that the surfacing underneath the junior slide needs attention so it is hoped this work will be done at the same time as the installation of the new equipment. This means that the slide may also be closed for use at the same time that the toddler area is out of action. We are also currently checking whether a post installation inspection will be required once the new play equipment has been installed, so if after the work is completed the play area remains closed, this will be why as we may have to wait for the inspection to be carried out before re-opening the play area. Please do bear with us if we have to get this carried out, we want to ensure the area is safe before it is opened up to little people!

Tree cutting in Broadmarsh Lane Amenity Area

It's very disappointing to have it reported to me this month that someone has had some of the trees trimmed in the Broadmarsh Lane amenity area without notifying the Parish Council AND has left all the branches dumped around the site which now looks a mess and is going to be additional work for our contractor to clear. This area is managed and maintained by the parish council so permission should be sought before any tree work is carried out in this area, and please note it is NOT to be used as a dumping ground. Thank you.

Memorial Trees and our new Tommy Soldier

I would like to pass on our thanks to Angela Spriggs who cleaned the brass plaques on the memorial trees and placed the crosses by them in readiness for Remembrance Day this year. Did any of you also manage to spot our new "Tommy" Solider silhouette statue at The Green? This is a new addition purchased this year from the Royal British Legion to commemorate all those who lost their lives fighting for our freedom. Tommy will be placed on The Green in the build up to Remembrance Day each year and I must admit I thought he looked great and was a fitting tribute. Our thanks to Amy Jackson (and her husband Greg McGlothlen) for placing the statue and for setting up the lovely lighting around him.



New bus service coming to Freeland!

I am pleased to report that at its November meeting Freeland Parish Council agreed to act as a conduit to enable the transfer of S106 developer funds from Oxfordshire County Council to First and Last Mile (CIC) who have done a huge amount of work over the past year to set up a community transport service to replace some of the crucial missing links in the local public bus network. First and Last Mile are a Community Interest Company run entirely by volunteers and they hope to launch their service on **4th January 2022**. The bus service will serve villages between Long Hanborough Station and Standlake via Eynsham, and will run every 2 hrs Mon – Fri, and will offer connections at Eynsham Church to the S1. Traffic Calming in Freeland – possible 20mph limit

As reported last month, Oxfordshire County Council are now changing their approach and acceptance of 20mph restrictions and simplifying the process for 20mph roads for those areas that want them. Freeland Parish Council would like to apply for a 20mph speed limit but firstly needs our County Councillor's support.

In order to consider providing this support, Liam Walker (our County Councillor) has therefore launched a consultation for residents living within his division to gain their feedback. This will remain open until **31st January** and he will then report back to the Parish Council to discuss the consultation results to ultimately decide whether to give his support to the 20mph application.



FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

A very Happy New Year to all gardeners. We hope it will be an enjoyable and colourful one for all. The autumn colour this year has been spectacular. The trees seem to change in a short time to their wonderful oranges, yellows, rusts, etc. The next step of course is that all the leaves have to come down! It is best not to leave them on a lawn too long, so sweep them up fairly often and pack them into bags to rot down in about 2 years time. These can then be used as a mulch. It is also possible to mow over leaves which will break them up so that they rot quicker.

The first frosts have left many annuals looking very sad so pull them up and put them on the compost heap. It is rather nice to have a general tidy up of the garden before the winter. It is not too late to put in some more bulbs for spring colour. If you have one, it is a good time to clean the greenhouse inside and out.

The large Amaryllis bulbs are in the shops now. They are very easy to grow, just leave half the bulb above the soil in a pot and water well. Children love seeing how fast they grow.

During the closure of Cuckoo Lane (8th-17th November) our Speedwatch Team was very active doing two sessions each day.

During this time there was a **62**% increase in the volume of traffic coming through Freeland with 9% of vehicles being reported for doing in excess of 35mph. Interestingly, this is the same percentage as before the closure.



During the first three weeks of September, 5 vehicles were recorded doing more than 50 mph (one at 63!!) but since 24th September the highest speed recorded has been 48mph. Thank you for slowing down and a big thank you to each member of the team who are doing such a tremendous job.

For the **440** people caught in the last couple of months, and for all our local residents, the message is clear - keep to the 30mph limit or you are likely to be caught!

OUT-OF-HOURS HIGHWAYS SERVICE IS UP & RUNNING

A new telephone number (**01223 849731**) has been launched for Oxfordshire residents to call for urgent out of hours highways related issues.

People can now report a highways matter to Oxfordshire County Council outside normal office hours – including evenings, weekends and bank holidays – if there are concerns about it causing an accident or damaging property. The call adviser will discuss the urgency of the issue and take appropriate action as required.

Councillor Glynis Phillips, Oxfordshire County Council's Cabinet Member for Corporate Services, said: "It is so important that people can access help with urgent matters whenever they need it, and this new out-of-hours telephone number will mean help is available at all times of the day."

During normal working hours, people should continue to call the council's customer service centre on **0345 310 1111**.

If the situation is potentially life threatening, people should call emergency services on **999.**

Councillor Tim Bearder, OCC's Cabinet Member for Highways Management, said: "In my division we recently had a large tree fall down in the middle of the night completely blocking the road. These things can happen at any time, so it is great news that there is now an emergency number for people to call when they need to report an issue urgently."

For highways issues that do not require immediate action, residents are encouraged to use the Fix My Street app (https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/) or complete an online form (https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/contactus/contact-highways-team).

<u>CPRE Oxfordshire Flooding and Pollution Report – a survey of</u> <u>Oxfordshire's Town & Parish Councils, 2021</u>

Findings show that at least 17% of towns & parishes in Oxfordshire experience flooding problems and at least 20% of towns & parishes experience issues with sewage/sewerage infrastructure.

CPRE Oxfordshire wants to see:

- Thames Water setting out clear measures to address the issues raised in this report, including targets and investment commitments.
- Local MPs supporting the Sewage (Inland Waters) Bill and the Environment Bill to ensure water companies are legally bound to stop discharging raw sewage into the ocean and rivers.
- Oxfordshire Plan 2050 to ensure all new developments demonstrate that their associated infrastructure will either maintain or improve water quality, not add to the risk of flooding, and be in place before the site is occupied.
- The river Thames to achieve Bathing Water designation.


