

Letter from our Rector, Rev. Steve Stewart:



Having just marked Remembrance Sunday in the churches of Hanborough and Freeland, we now look forward to the season of Advent, beginning on **Advent Sunday 27 November.** Advent is the period in the church calendar during which we mark not only the birth of Jesus Christ into the world, but anticipate his coming again – just as he promised time and again to his disciples.

2022 has been a turbulent year, from the war in Ukraine to rising energy bills, and from environmental issues to worries over food prices and mortgages. For many the dilemma as to whether to "heat or eat" has never been sharper.

But as Christians we believe and have experienced that into this turmoil of life, Jesus brings peace. Indeed, this is one of the great titles given to Jesus through the prophet Isaiah in a passage read so commonly at Christmas: "Prince of peace". But he also bears the title "King of kings and Lord of lords", and when he comes again and restores his order to creation, if we turn to him we will see great promise fulfilled, that "He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death" or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away" (Revelation 21:4). I pray God's blessing of peace upon our whole community this Advent and Christmas.



FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL UPDATES

Inspired Villages update

The planning inquiry into West Oxfordshire District Council's refusal of a proposal to build 160 retirement homes on land in the grounds of Freeland House started on the 8th November. Although it was supposed to conclude on Friday 11th November, an extra two days have been scheduled as proceedings are taking longer than intended. Part of the reason for this is the amount of evidence being presented by both appellant (Inspired Villages) and the Council.

Freeland Parish Council and Freeland Friends have joined the process as what is known as a Rule 6 party, which means we are also giving evidence against the proposal and supporting the refusal, although our participation is far more limited in scope than either of the main parties. Nonetheless, it has been made clear that local views are important, hence - given the strength of feeling within the village against this development - we are presenting our case on grounds of Landscape, Design, Heritage, Need, Viability and Planning considerations.

The proceedings have been in person in the Council offices at Woodgreen in Witney, although there was a site visit on the Friday morning, where the proposed location for the development was toured by the inspector and representatives from each party. The inspector also visited the site on her own earlier in the week, and walked through the permissive access routes and around the village so she could get an idea of the context of the setting and the village.

The two extra days that have been scheduled will be virtual (online), and are on Friday 18th November and Monday 28th November. It is unknown when the inspector will rule, but as she originally planned to release her decision in the second week of December, we hope there may be a decision before the end of the year.

The efforts of Freeland to fight what almost all villagers seem to view as a wholly inappropriate proposal, and have the appeal dismissed, are being managed by planning consultant Mike Gilbert, who lives in the village and is co-ordinating our efforts as well as giving most of the evidence. Amy Jackson is also giving evidence, and Roger Faulkner is delivering the opening and closing statements. A number of different people have been of enormous help in the village, whether carrying out research, inputting ideas, turning up to the inquiry, or just being generally encouraging and supportive!

We will keep you posted on progress. Whatever the eventual outcome of this appeal, it's important we feel we've done what we can to fight it.

On the first day of the Inquiry a scarf was left on one of the seats. If this belongs to you please get in contact with me.



Apparently, the developers very much need to understand **ALL** the concerns and reservations of local residents, as they must to show they have made significant efforts to consult and have done what they can to address material concerns. This includes

ANY concerns at all over specific areas of visual impact affecting the character of the countryside and so on. They say any comment made via the online feedback form or through the post, on a feedback form at events or via **info@botleywest.co.uk**, will be recorded by the communications team and will be read by the planning and design team.

It's also worth knowing the process is different for this project from, say, housing developments. West Oxfordshire DC, Vale of White Horse DC, Cherwell DC and Oxfordshire CC are consultees in this, not decision-makers. When ready, the 'Development Consent Order' (DCO) application for it to go ahead will be submitted direct to the Government's Planning Inspectorate (PINS). After conducting public hearings, PINS will make a recommendation to the Secretary of State for BEIS, which is currently the Rt Hon. Grant Shapps. The final decision rests with the Secretary of State. His decision can only be appealed on a point of law. If you have recorded an interest in this, you should be informed about the public hearings.

So please use this opportunity to understand what this project might mean for you and what the pros and cons might be, and make your voice heard if you want a say.

FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

There is no meeting of the Club in December, but as the Grapevine comes out before the end of the month, it's worth mentioning our meeting on **Monday 28th November at 7.30pm** in Freeland Hall again!

Mandy Bradshaw, who is new to the Club, is coming to tell us about 'The Four Seasons - Cotswold Style'. Maybe she will give us some suggestions of places worth visiting next summer. Subs at the increased rate of $\pounds 20$ a year will be due at this meeting and a programme card of the new year's events given on payment. Thanks to our programme Secretary June Counsell who took over the daunting task of organising a programme when Ray Evans moved to Witney. Plant and Garden Items Sale as usual.

Jobs for the end of the year include mulching beds to improve the soil, sweeping up leaves, particularly from areas where they may get slippery, and saving them pressed down in a container to make leaf mould in about 2 years time.

Continue feeding birds and giving them fresh water, clean the greenhouse and insulate it with bubble wrap if storing tender plants there over the winter. Check the greenhouse heater, if using it, but many plants can be grown safely in a cold greenhouse. Ventilate it on warmer days. Insulate outdoor taps and hoses. Clean tools and store any not used during winter.

Lift root vegetables and store in sand in a cool dry place. Cover brassicas to keep birds off. Mulch veg beds not in use. Divide rhubarb, chop the crown into pieces and replant pieces each with a bud and planted the same way up as before. Sew winter salads. Broad beans can be planted now for an earlier crop, preferably in modules in the greenhouse.

WARNING OF ROAD CLOSURES etc.



To enable the construction of the new Park and Ride site being built near Eynsham, Oxfordshire County Council are implementing a speed limit reduction to **30mph** for the period **Monday 24th October to Saturday 31st December** in the portion of **Cuckoo Lane (from A40 heading northwards for 300m to the electricity substation).**

The County Council estimates that the Park and Ride construction project will be completed in early 2024, and opening, with other improvements, in late 2025.

The Green, Freeland between Heritage Cottage and Orchard House in both directions for sewer repairs to the carriageway - REVISED DATES....

The effect of the traffic order is to temporarily prohibit any vehicle proceeding along that section of The Green. There are exemptions for emergency services, for the works, and for access to premises which are only accessible from the closed section of the road. The revised dates for the closure are from:


