Whether I like it or not – I can't seem to get off, it won't slow down, and even the emergency handle is having no effect. Now that may not sound like a positive reflection for someone who loves Christmas, but I, like most of us, find some parts of

Well deserved thanks

We would like to start this Grapevine article by thanking people. With it being the end of another tough year for many, especially financially, we need to recognise and praise all the hard work that has gone on around us. Apologies for anyone we have missed below:



Councillors, new and old, thanks needs to be given to you all for the support, drive and passion to get what is best for the village of Freeland. Long may this continue.

Memorial poppies. Massive thanks to the Craft Club for decorating the village Memorial Trees with the beautiful crafted poppies in honour of those who died in the World Wars.

Kenny Wylie - thank you for running this amazing newsletter monthly - it allows the village to connect together and we would miss it greatly if it wasn't available. Also, thanks to the team of volunteers who deliver it around the village.

Last, but not least, thank you to the **Inspired Villages Appeal team!** We now know that the Inspired Village request to the High Court to challenge the Planning Inspectorate's Appeal Decision earlier in 2023 has been refused for a second time. This was at an oral 'permission' hearing put to a judge in an effort to secure a full High Court challenge.

We understand that the decision to refuse was communicated on the 21st September. Inspired Villages had 21 days from 21st September to appeal this decision, but no appeal was lodged and they have also paid costs to the Planning Inspectorate, which suggests they have accepted the decision.

There is no chance of appeal now, so thanks in particular to **Amy Jackson** and **Mike Gilbert** for their huge effort in making our case, as well as **Roger Faulkner**, the **Freeland Friends**, **Parish Councillors** at the time, and everyone else who contributed to the preparation of village's case against the Appeal.

Noticeboards

Now that we have the new noticeboards please can only village relevant information be placed on them? There is limited space, so please can all posters be A4 or smaller. Anything not related to the village will be removed.

Additionally there has been a rise in number of bikes being attached to the new boards and the bus stops. We have spent a lot of money on these and we want them to last a long time. It would be very much appreciated if they weren't used as a bike rest.

Green Tip

The weather continues to be characterised by warmth, increased rainfall, and storms, all of which bear the fingerprints of climate change. Globally 2023 is predicted to be the hottest year on record. But how can we be sure that the extreme weather events are indeed the result of human induced climate change? There is now consensus from the scientific community regarding anthropogenic climate change, primarily caused by the burning of fossil fuels and unending consumption. However, there are plenty of thinktanks, usually funded by vested interests, that seek to deny or downplay the impact of humans on the climate. For anyone not studying climate change it can be difficult to know what to believe.

World leaders experienced the same dilemma in the 1980s when climate change started to come to the fore. With so much information available it was difficult to know who to believe. To combat this issue in 1988 the UN formed the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) to report on the current situation regarding the climate crisis. IPCC reports are the results of many, many years of work by hundreds of scientists from across the globe, reviewing all the relevant scientific research on climate change and its impacts—hundreds and hundreds of scientific articles in international, peer-reviewed journals. These reports represent an international, mainstream consensus that even very cautious, reticent members of the scientific community are prepared to stand behind. These reports run into many hundreds of pages. Fortunately, the IPCC produce headline reports that are available to everyone. These are the gold standard of climate change and are frequently updated. So, for anyone trying to understand the current situation there can be no better place to go than the IPCC

A VILLAGE DESIGN STATEMENT FOR FREELAND

With input from Freeland residents - Freeland Parish Council in conjunction with West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) intend to explore the possibilities of producing our own Village Design Statement. (VDS)

When completed, this VDS would sit alongside the WODC Local Plan as a supplementary planning document bespoke to Freeland.

It would set out what we, as residents, feel about...OUR VILLAGE. What makes it special, unique or maybe what could be improved? So, when, or if development is proposed (from a modest extension to new dwellings) we have already thought long and hard about the things we value and the things we do not wish to see lost under the wheels of change.

A VDS would neither prevent nor encourage development but add a nuanced understanding of the implications development may have on our village. To that end, a VDS will need to be far reaching, to include History, Cartography, Landscape, Biodiversity, Hydrology, Climate change, Sustainability and Photography old & new, etc.

WHO WILL PROVIDE THE CONTENT?

Every resident will be consulted, every group from School to Church, Sports team to Allotment society.

A potential 12-month project will produce a booklet complete with maps/ text and photos; (for an example, visit 'Combe Village Design Statement', recently adopted by WODC)








Freeland District

Both units iced biscuits before the new members made their promise.








