<u>THE REVEREND STEVE STEWART -</u> <u>Rector of Hanborough and Freeland</u>

On the evening of Tuesday 19th January, The Reverend Steve Stewart was instituted into his new ministry by a special video conferencing service as we formally welcomed him to Hanborough and Freeland.

The Bishop of Oxford, The Right Reverend Dr Steven Croft, led the service as Steve made his declaration and swore the oaths to enable the Bishop to present our new Rector of this Benefice.

Maybe it was not the service that we would have all initially hoped for, but it did enable many more people than usual to participate than would have been the case in a traditional service of institution. There were over 250 people who were able to join on Zoom from all over the country, made up of not only parishioners from Hanborough and Freeland, but also Steve's previous parish of Cove and previous ministries. The service itself was beautifully presented with music, readings and prayers and included contributions from our Archdeacon, Area Dean, Lay Chair, Ministry team, Churchwardens, Representative from the Methodist Circuit, Deputy Lieutenant of the County of Oxfordshire, Headteacher of Manor School, and Parish representatives from both Hanborough and Freeland.

It is a real blessing to have Steve with us now, and may God bless him and his family as they settle into their new lives here, in this, the most unusual of times.

Letter from our new Rector:

I am *writing* this, on 3rd January, "Epiphany Sunday" – more about that in a moment. We are in our last couple of days in Hampshire. By the time you *read* this the hope is that I will have been installed as the Rector of Hanborough and Freeland.

The removals company begin packing tomorrow. And on 6 January 2021 – Epiphany itself – we move to our new home among you. Amanda and I are full of excitement, hopes, prayers, anticipation – and a little anxiety too. Everything in our lives – and by "our", I mean yours as well as ours – seems to be in transition, from the small things of our moving home to a spiralling pandemic. The future looks more like a series of question marks than a carefully planned spreadsheet of everything that is going to happen in the churches and in our community over the coming months.

Epiphany marks the journey and visit of the Magi to Joseph and Mary to worship Jesus, anticipating the flight to Egypt of Joseph and Mary with Jesus to escape the murderous King Herod. The birth account of Jesus parallels our current experience: anticipation, journeying, transition, and yes, anxiety. Yet, just as in the rollout of the Covid vaccines we have hope in all of the despair, so the lowly born Jesus was and is the hope of the world. Epiphany is not just a time of transition for Joseph and Mary with Jesus, but a time of transition, journeying, waiting and hoping for the entire world. Indeed, a huge part of being a follower of Jesus is to be somebody who waits, hopes and anticipates.

FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL – LISA'S NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 18th JANUARY 2021 Annual Parish Meeting/Big Lunch 2021

The Council gave some consideration as to whether to start planning for these events later this year. Due to the current Covid situation with the daily infection numbers and death rates as high as they are, and although the vaccine roll out has started, Councillors felt that it was unlikely that by the end of April, people would feel comfortable enough to sit in a village hall with 100+ other people, assuming of course that restrictions had eased sufficiently to even allow this! So, it was agreed to not plan for these events for the time being, and as and when things change, then it may be decided to hold them later in the year.

Parish Council Elections

Similar to the above, at the moment the Council have been informed that WODC are planning for these to go ahead, although it is felt highly likely that the elections will be postponed again to either later in the year or to 2022. No firm decisions have yet been made, but I will keep you posted as and when I know more. Some Councillors have already expressed their intention to step down from the Council at the next elections, so if you have a little time to spare, and you would be available to attend a meeting once a month on a Monday evening, please do consider becoming a Councillor! They are a friendly bunch who do their best to improve Freeland and make it a fantastic village to live in, whilst listening to residents' views on how things can be made better! It's a great way to get involved in your village and to help make a real difference. Contact me if you'd like to know more or to register your interest.

happen in the evening or at night. This is obviously very disappointing to report, and most upsetting and unpleasant for the residents concerned. The Parish Council have been asked to take some action, but unfortunately, we are unable to as this is not within our remit. The best course of action for residents in the face of such incidents is always to contact the police, directly and immediately. The Council would also encourage anyone who has any photographic evidence to forward it directly to the police. We can only expect the police to take action if ALL crimes are reported. Anyone can report a crime that they witness. You do not need to be the owner of the property, as there will be times when the owner is not known, and it will help if the same crime is reported several times. This will then establish that a problem exists, and hopefully action will be taken. If you can record the time and place, and get a photograph of the damage, or even those causing the damage, then that's even better.

Luckily these types of incidents are rare in our lovely village, and so it comes as a bit of a shock when these horrible things happen. Please be extra vigilant and if anyone saw anything or has any information about this, please contact your local police by ringing **101**. Thank you.

Daffodils

As advised last month, the lovely daffodil bulbs are now starting to push through ready to display their beautiful bright cheery yellow flowers. These bulbs have been lovingly planted by members of the Gardening Club and every year the flowers make a stunning display throughout the village. Please be mindful that the bulbs are particularly vulnerable whilst they are coming through, so please keep off the grass verges where they have been planted. Thanks very much.

Coronavirus - an update

So here we are in yet another lockdown, and I know this is a worrying time for many so I would like to reassure you that the volunteer service is here to help again with medication collection, or food shopping etc. You should all have received a flyer through your door a week or so ago giving details of what help is available. Do keep hold of the flyer, even if you don't need any assistance right now, if you suddenly become unwell or need to self-isolate, then you can at least know there is help available should you need it. A few things have changed since last year so here is an update on help that is available:

I. Essential food shopping

If you are unable to leave the house, ring the dedicated Co-op number on **0800 435902** between **8.30am-5.00pm** to place an order and pay over the phone. They will then arrange delivery of your shopping to you.

2. Prescription collections

If you cannot collect your medicine yourself or are worried about leaving the house, order your meds as normal via the pharmacy (either online or by calling the pharmacy on **01993 880351**), 7 calendar days in advance, make the payment if needed and then call me on **01993 880067** (or Mary Ann on **01993 881027**) or email **lisa.fpc@gmail.com** to let me know when it will be ready. A local volunteer from Freeland will then deliver your prescription. *Continued*......

ROADWORKS ON WROSLYN ROAD from A4095 to BROADMARSH LANE (southern end)

Oxfordshire County Council have carriageway patching works planned in the section of **Wroslyn Road,** from its junction with the A4095, to the Wroslyn Road junction with the southern end of Broadmarsh Lane.

These works are scheduled for Thursday 18th and Friday 19th February from 09.30 to 15.30 each day.

OCC say that limited access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for frontages within the closed section, subject to the progress of the works. OCC also state that where yellow "No Waiting" cones are in place you will not be able to park vehicles on the highway.

The suggested alternative route is via the A4095, Cuckoo Lane and Wroslyn Road and reverse.

FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

Christmas and New Year are now behind us, so we have spring to look forward to. In spite of cold weather the bulbs are beginning to peep through the soil. We have actually had daffodils flowering for about 6 weeks and it is only the beginning of January as I write this! It is sometimes good to gently fork around the bulbs to loosen the soil but be careful not to decapitate any.

Sweep leaves off hard surfaces to prevent them getting slippery. Now is a good time to check over your tools and give them a clean, oil and sharpen where necessary. Tidying the shed or greenhouse are also ideal jobs to do out of the cold. If you still have stems of plants left over from last year cut them back and tidy around the plants. It is also beneficial to mulch as much of the garden as possible. This helps to keep the weeds down later and breaks up the soil. Use garden compost or buy something suitable from the Garden Centre.

It is a good time to plant bare rooted plants such as trees, fruit and rose bushes during their dormant period. They are also cheaper. Soak them well before planting and follow the instructions the supplier gives.

If you are designing a new garden or reorganising a present one, don't try to do it all at once or you will have a one season garden. Buy plants that are at their best in each season in order to have interest throughout the year.

Continue to feed the birds as they will have a limited source of food particularly in bad weather. Don't forget to give them a good supply of fresh clean water to drink and wash in.

Once again enjoy your indoor plants by careful watering, turning and cleaning them from time to time.

How wonderful nature is that whatever is going on in the world plants will always be there to cheer us up.

We still do not know when Gardening Club Meetings will be able to return, but hopefully it will be sometime before the summer.

something out for you. We cannot supply specific titles, but we can deliver books from a genre of your choice, as long as we have them (thrillers, for example).





KEY CONSULTANTS TO DEVELOP SALT CROSS ENERGY PLAN

Specialist consultants have been brought in to work on energy planning for the Salt Cross garden village.

Urbanomy, a new subsidiary of energy provider EDF, has been appointed by Oxfordshire County Council to support Project LEO (Local Energy Oxfordshire).

This contract is a part of the Eynsham Smart and Fair Futures project led by the Low Carbon Hub within LEO.

Other partners include West Oxfordshire District Council with funding from Homes England, the University of Oxford, Oxford Brookes University, the Scottish and Southern Electricity Network and low carbon community action group Eynsham GreenTEA.

Urbanomy will build on the published Energy Action Plan (EAP) of the area and assess the energy supply and demand, including smart electric mobility and its impact on the local grid and the wider area.

This will demonstrate the integration of the elements for a smart local energy system and the routes to reach net-zero carbon, taking into account the viability of proposed solutions and demonstrating the benefits for the local community.

Urbanomy will also provide visual displays, adding to the other mapping and strategic tools developed in LEO, to help promote the project locally.

Cllr Jeff Haine, Cabinet Member for Strategic Planning at West Oxfordshire District Council, said: "As with every aspect of Salt Cross, we are looking for a highly innovative solution to energy provision.

"It is essential that it is as climate friendly as possible while delivering the comprehensive energy needs of a thriving, modern community. I am fascinated to see how these plans develop."

Llewelyn Morgan, Head of Innovation at Oxfordshire County Council, added: "Urbanomy will join us to create a new model that will enable a net-zero carbon energy system for Salt Cross, one which benefits the new residents and those already living nearby."

Meanwhile, the garden village delivery team are moving forwards and anticipate our expert consultants' financial viability report imminently, with a date for the Planning Inspectorate hearing to determine the draft Area Action Plan to follow.

They continue to work closely with the business community to develop local business and job opportunities for Salt Cross.

Bear & Monkey would like to thank everyone for their tremendous support in 2020.


The November quiz that so many of you took part in, raised **£2,255** on the night & this was double-matched by a corporate supporter, resulting in a grand total of **£6,765**.

Gardening for bees and other pollinators

Bee facts

250 species of bees in the UK 224 wild solitary bees 25 wild bumble bees One domesticated honey bee



Trees you can plant this winter to help pollinators

Male grey willow (sallow) Salix cinerea Goat willow Salix caprea Small-leaved lime Tilia cordata Service trees: Sorbus torminalis, Sorbus domestica Apple Malus sp - any, fruit bearing, or ornamental Cherry Plum - Prunus cerasifera Wild Hawthorn - Crataegus monogyna/laevigata

Gardening tips

Leave the dead plant stems over winter. Hollow stems may be used by bees for over wintering.

Provide flowers throughout the year - some bees emerge as early as February. Buy organic to ensure bulbs and plants haven't been treated with neonicitinoids. Have a flowering lawn.

Provide a source of water for bees.

Leave a patch of bare earth - mason bees gather mud to build egg cells.

Include a variety flower shapes - different species have different tongue lengths..

REDUCE THE SPEED LIMIT ON LOWER ROAD!



A recent head on collision on Lower Road near the Willow Cottage Nursery, has brought the issue of traffic safety on this road into the focus again. A petition has been created on **change.org**

Please reduce the speed limit, exclude aggregate lorry traffic and facilitate cycling on Lower Road.

Lower Road is a narrow, winding, unclassified country road, which runs from the A4095 junction east of Long Hanborough to the Eynsham roundabout on the A40. In recent years, it has become a busy traffic corridor due to massive growth in population and intensified business and commerce activities nearby and further afield. It is also being routinely used by aggregate lorries and increasingly by drivers trying to avoid traffic congestion elsewhere. Because of its nature and condition, Lower Road is unsuitable to carry such large volumes of traffic. The current national speed limit of 60 mph is totally inappropriate. Lower Road is dangerous! The imminent expansion of Eynsham will make matters much worse. Urgent action is required!
