Letter from our Associate Rector, Rev. Mike Madden:

Dear Friends,

A simple reminder - God loves you

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16)

It is easy to forget in the busyness of life that quite simply God loves us. God loves our family, God loves our parents, and God loves our children. He loves our friends; he loves our neighbours; he loves our boss, and he even loves our enemies too!

In John 3:16, quoted above, we are reminded that God loves the whole world. So much so that he gave his one and only Son to die on the cross. This gospel, which literally means 'good news', restores our relationship with God, the environment, ourselves, and each other. The life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, (called the atonement by theologians), allow access to God for every man, women, boy and girl on the planet. In truth the gospel is quite simply amazing. Throughout history we see men and women who were so captivated by the love of God for them personally, that God's love overflowed from them to others through acts of service. For some this involved giving up creature comforts, status, even riches to serve God in quite dangerous places sometimes a long way from home. (If you have five minutes Google Eric Liddle, C. T. Studd, Catherine Booth, and Corrie Ten Boom.)

This gospel, that can and should transform us, is so incredible, so wonderful so mind blowing that I suspect that many of us (myself included) have only scratched the surface of what Jesus really did on the cross. It is an act of cosmic and historical significance, that resides both in time and outside time reaching back to the beginning of time forwards to the end of time itself.

The challenge for Christians throughout the generations has never been the message, the gospel message continues to be radical, relevant and life changing. The challenge for Christians throughout the generations has always been the desire to settle rather than to pioneer and explore.

It is no mistake that one of the final things Jesus said to his disciples in Acts 1:8 as he prepared his disciples for his ascension was, "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." With the benefit of hindsight, we can see that the scriptures are full of God's plan to spread the good news about Jesus from Jerusalem to the whole world. The good news of Jesus might have started in Jerusalem, but the plan was for it to go from Jerusalem to Judea to Samaria to the ends of the earth (which includes a village or town near you!)

So, in conclusion, a good ambition for each one of us might simply be 'to know the love of God and give it away'. So if you know deep down that God loves you, pass on the good news of Jesus. If you have never known God's love, pick up a bible and read the gospels, come to one of our church services in Freeland, Church Hanborough, or Long Hanborough that are conveniently all at **10.00am**, or attend our Alpha course that meets on Monday evenings in the Rectory, and let God reveal his love for you.



FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL UPDATES

Correction

We would like to make it clear that a sentence in the Parish Council notes in the December 2022 edition was incorrect.

The proposed area for the Inspired Villages retirement homes is NOT in the grounds of Freeland House. Freeland House have no connection with Inspired Villages' proposed development.

New Parish Councillor - Mark O'Callaghan

I moved to Freeland last November from Colchester with my wife Jo after she was successful in securing a position as a CNS at The Churchill Hospital in Oxford and with three grown up sons dotted around the country it made sense to move more centrally.

As I retired a few years ago, and after taking a few months to settle into the area, I've now taken on several volunteer roles providing help and support in the local community with joining the Freeland Parish Council last month being the most recent.



We both enjoy running, music, theatre, long country walks and socialising with good food and drink and Freeland is proving to be the perfect place to do all these things.

I've always enjoyed meeting and chatting with people and I'm looking forward as a Parish Councillor to working with everyone and helping to ensure Freeland remains a great place to live.

Follow up to the village survey 2022

You might remember that the Parish Council discussed the results of last year's village survey at its July meeting, and agreed a number of 'next steps', most of which have unfortunately been pushed back due to the retirement village planning appeal, which soaked up considerable Parish Council time between August and December 2022.

However, the Parish Council was able to set up a public meeting in October to discuss Salt Cross and the proposed 20mph zone and another update on these will be planned for the **Annual Parish Meeting on Friday 21st April 2023**.

Regarding other 'next steps', over 30 people expressed interest in helping with the survey follow up. We're still planning to approach these people throughout January and early February, with a view to setting up a meeting on **Friday 3rd March** to discuss launching working groups focusing on **I)** social opportunities/community/ inclusion, and **2)** sustainability/green issues. There was also an intent to set up further groups on village amenities, and transport/traffic, but we will wait to see how we get on with the first two!

More information will be circulated nearer the time, but in the meantime, anyone interested in being part of a village working group on these issues, please get in touch with Fay the clerk on 01993 357851 or fayf.fpc@gmail.com

PHOTO ID REQUIRED FOR ELECTIONS FROM 4th MAY

Residents in West Oxfordshire District will need to show photographic ID to vote in person at this year's local elections which are being held on Thursday 4th May.

Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK, EEA or Commonwealth drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo and the name on the ID should be the same name as appears on the Electoral Register.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free ID online at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate or by completing a paper form which is available from West Oxfordshire District Council at the Woodgreen office. If you need any help with applying for the free ID, or want to request an application form, contact the electoral services team on 01993 861410.

More information is available on the West Oxfordshire District Council website (www.westoxon.gov.uk), including details of how to apply for the free ID. Anyone not able to visit the Council website, or apply for a Voter Authority Certificate online, is being encouraged to contact the Council as soon as possible and no later than the 5pm deadline on Wednesday 25 April.

Anyone who wants to have their say in the elections this May must also be registered to vote. If you aren't already registered it only takes five minutes to register online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote. Voters wishing to apply to their council for free ID should first make sure they are registered to vote.

The changes do not affect postal votes but do affect proxy voters who will be required to show their own valid ID when voting on behalf of someone else.

I would like to ask for your help. At our last Scouts' session we looked back at all of the things that the Scouts were able to achieve, experience and enjoy in 2022.

RETIREMENT VILLAGE APPEAL DISMISSED!

The proposal by Inspired Villages to build 160 retirement units on land to the west of Wroslyn Road, adjacent to Freeland House, was unanimously rejected by West Oxfordshire District Council but the developers appealed this decision.

The Planning Inspectorate appointed Hannah Porter to hear the appeal which took place over six days in November and December 2022. The Inspector delivered her decision on 18th January which was to **dismiss the appeal**.

In her 18 page statement she stated "I have judged the adverse impacts of granting planning permission would significantly and demonstrably outweigh the benefits". The full text of the Appeal decision can be found on the Freeland Parish Council website www.freelandpc.org.uk, under the 'Reports' tab.

An awful lot of hard work was undertaken in fighting the appeal, both by West
 Oxfordshire District Council and by Freeland Parish Council and Freeland Friends
 who were jointly given what is known as Rule 6 Party status that enabled us to
 take a full, active and equal part in the Inquiry. Grateful thanks are therefore given
 to all those who helped, in any way, and who contributed in making such an
 effective and winning team.



WODC WORKS TO REDUCE POLLUTION OF OUR WATERWAYS WITH UNTREATED SEWAGE

Thames Water discharge raw sewage into West Oxfordshire rivers for fifteen thousand hours every year. West Oxfordshire District Council has no obligation, nor legal power to radically change this dire situation, but we felt that it was our responsibility as an elected local authority to address this issue. The Council committed to work closely with Thames Water, the Environment Agency, other key local organisations such as Windrush Against Sewage Pollution, and community groups. We organised a 'Waterways Day' to strengthen these collaborations and provide a platform for the engagement with the public. It was a great success!

Our team, which includes myself, Cllr Charlie Maynard, Cllr Alaric Smith and the council officers have met with Thames Water team monthly since early autumn. We keep asking questions about the capacities of Thames Water sewage networks and treatment work stations in West Oxfordshire. We ask how Thames Water determine and update the population numbers they are using to estimate their infrastructure capacity needs. Every meeting brings some progress. So far, Thames Water have acknowledged that they currently do not have sufficient sewage treatment capacity at the six Sewage Treatment Works in West Oxfordshire. This conversation is ongoing.

We have encouraged Thames Water to work with us at the planning level. In mid-November Thames Water updated their statement towards the planning application for 150 homes at North Field in Long Hanborough. They asked for a condition of no occupancy at the development until all sewage works upgrades required are in place. Thames Water are prepared to place requests for such conditions towards major housing developments planning applications in other areas, where there is no sufficient capacity within sewage network infrastructure.

Obviously, this strategy may lead to delays in the necessary growth of housing in West Oxfordshire. However, it is not sustainable to pump into our rivers an additional 30 tonnes (roughly equivalent in volume to a standard size shipping container) of raw sewage per day for each 100 new houses.

The team will continue to work closely with Thames Water at the planning level to make sure that any new TW infrastructure capacity investments planned are aligned with the locations of housing projects in the currently being developed WO District Local Plan 2041.

Along with other pressure groups the Council had been asking that Thames Water develop an alert system accessible online, that would monitor real-time raw sewage spills from their storm overflow tanks.

This system is now live at https://www.thameswater.co.uk/edm-map.

While this is a step forward, it is really disappointing to see that at least at the time of this article writing all Sewage Treatment Works along the river Evenlode are or have been discharging raw sewage into the river within the last 48hours; some for more than 100 hours already.

Our work is in progress!

BOTLEY WEST SOLAR FARM

I wonder if you are aware of the proposal called the Botley West Solar Farm? It's a plan to cover an area of 3,500 acres of local agricultural land with approximately 500,000 solar panels.

If the plans are accepted by Government, the panels will be installed in three areas and the middle section, the biggest, will fill nearly every field between the local villages of Bladon, Cassington, Long Hanborough, Church Hanborough and Yarnton, covering agricultural land.

Of course, making use of solar power is a sensible objective for this country, but there are alternative renewable sources. Solar panels are least effective in winter when more electricity is needed, compared wind turbines which operate when the sun doesn't shine, and more effective in winter.

If built, this could be the biggest site in Europe and one of the largest in the world. ALL other sites of comparable size are in arid/desert regions with high sunlight and very low population density. e.g. Caceres, Spain - 20 people/Km² versus Hanborough 409 people/Km² (and growing) with approximately half the sunshine hours.

WARNING OF ROAD CLOSURES etc.


