Dear friends,

I wonder what your new year will hold? Fresh start? New friends? New job? New hope? Or perhaps not so much change? Same job, same family, same friends? There are aspects of the new year which I like - but there are aspects of the new year I really don't like. Few of us, when asked 'what have you achieved this last year' are likely to reel off a large list of our successes, we are more likely to get slightly disheartened.

And yet many of us have made significant progress in our lives. We've all weaned many of us have learnt to write and talk and walk. Many of us can drive and more importantly we have the capacity to love. Many of us have friends and a roof over our heads. White line painting

Some of you may have noticed that the white lines have FINALLY been repainted by the corner of Parklands and Wroslyn Road so that they extend further around the corner. This is something I have been trying to get done for around 9 months, and I am so pleased that they have finally been done. This is to help keep the junction clear of cars, especially at school drop off and pick up times when it can get incredibly busy and chaotic. Please help to keep the school zone safe by not parking on these white lines, they are there for a reason and it's much better and safer for everyone if people park sensibly and walk the extra few steps to the school.

Some access protection markings have also been painted by the driveway of the two houses opposite the school, plus some by the houses near the village hall. Again, please do not park on these lines, they are there to protect the access to these houses who regularly have their driveways blocked by people parking inconsiderately. Thank you your co-operation is much appreciated.

Patchwork resurfacing

The patchwork resurfacing work has also now been completed (plus the cutting back of the trees and bushes) along Cuckoo Lane, which should help to improve the road surface and stop cars being scratched by the large branches that were sticking out. There is still some road surface that needs doing but we've been informed that sadly this doesn't meet the criteria for fixing as yet.

So, in the meantime if you spot a pothole, the quickest and easiest way to report it directly to OCC Highways via the Fix my Street website at

https://www.fixmystreet.com/. Just put in the postcode or road name, give details of the problem and it will get sent to OCC Highways to be fixed. Photos are often helpful to include as well to help identify where the problem is or how big a pothole it is. Thanks.
