



### Letter from our Curate, Rev. Heather McCulloch:

#### Holiday booked - but will it be a real adventure?

As we teeter on the brink of a New Year – drawing a deep breath and wondering what lies in store before we plunge down the slope into our busy lives again – I want to prolong that pause just for a moment more. Like the prayer at the top of a black run – will this year bring all we hope it will, will we dodge the ice and make the leap? What if our hopeful dreams didn't have to end in quiet despair. Suppose there really is a reason for joy rather than cynicism this year.

There's something about the start of a new year that causes us to pause – that moment might come as we shove the last of the tinsel and baubles into the loft with a relieved heave or run the hoover round for the last time after the rellies have finally left. We survived 'it', the crazy Christmas season when we may have felt completely overwhelmed by people and consumption.



Or we may have felt more alone than ever, trying to keep jolly for other people whilst pretending to ourselves that we don't really mind being on our own. Perhaps the pause comes as we take a deep breath and face the cold stark month of January with a few extra pounds around the waist and rather too few pounds in the bank. At least part of us hopes for something more from this year -1 wonder if you do?

I want to invite you to consider making time for a *real* adventure. This isn't a short-term holiday thrill, this is a life-long expedition but with genuine excitement and growing joyful hope. Would you come and share the journey with me? I don't know what lies ahead for you or for me this year – but I know that Jesus walks beside me in it and that tangible encounter gives me irrepressible hope and determined joy. 

### EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP UPDATE

#### **Covid Booster Clinics**

Our practice has worked continuously during the summer to vaccinate those eligible for covid vaccines and our fabulous team of Volunteers have worked so well in organising the queues, keeping everyone safe and reducing the queues swiftly.



We started our Covid Booster campaign a little earlier than most of the local surgeries to make sure we keep patients safe this Autumn through to the Winter season.

We continued with our Friday Covid Clinics then as demand grew, we were grateful to have a strong team who worked additional hours at weekends to assist in keeping up with the demand for vaccination.

We added a Covid booking line to help reduce the calls for our hard-working Patient Care Advisor (PCA) team, as their phone lines are constantly busy. This helped those who were not able to book online to receive their Covid Booster appointment. After 3 months the calls coming through to this phoneline reduced to only a few calls within the hour. We therefore decided to close the booking line for this year and pass all enquiries back to the reception team.

Saturday 26th November was our last Saturday clinic. Our Friday Clinics will continue until the **16th December 2022**. At time of going to press we do not have information to advise of any further Covid Clinics.

#### Flu Clinics

We have now completed all our walk in Clinics for Flu Vaccinations.

We decided to trial walk in clinics this Autumn. There was, we understood patient concern in case of long queues.

We had a very strong team of both vaccinators and volunteers, so in the event the queues reduced very quicky. The only time the queues became long was first thing in the morning as lots of patients had the same idea, to come early to miss the queues. From 9.30am the queues reduced again, so patients arriving were being called straight in for their vaccinations.

Unfortunately, demand for our second walk in clinic for the under 65-year-olds, was much higher than anticipated. Within an hour and a half, we had vaccinated over 700 patients which was great going but unfortunately exhausted our vaccine supply before demand stopped. We unfortunately had no choice but to turn away the remaining queue for which we are very sorry.

Despite replenishing our stock, we have now again exhausted our supply of vaccine for the under 65 years of age group. Hanborough Pharmacy have also exhausted their supply of vaccines for under 65-year-olds and are unfortunately unable to get any more vaccine from their suppliers.

#### Planning Application Refused

As you may have seen from postings elsewhere, WODC have refused the Methodist Circuit's planning application to convert the Methodist Church into a single dwelling. WODC have agreed with the many objections submitted by FCBS, Freeland residents and others, one in particular from their own Business



Development Officer, and consider that the building is unsuitable as a private dwelling and should be used by the Community as a shop and cafe, in line with the existing planning permission.

While as always, planning decisions are made on the basis of relevant regulations, we are sure that the views of the Community are taken into account and Freeland CBS management team would like to thank all those resident who submitted their objections to this proposal. We are hoping the the Circuit will not follow the lengthy and expensive appeals procedure, but will finally enter into discussions with FCBS about how this building can be used for its true purpose as a centre for community engagement. Should they decide to go to appeal we are sure that you will again make your views known.



coming months. Post-covid we are still financing 4 soup kitchens in Adelaide, offering hot food to hundreds of children in this district.

Last year our long-time patron Archbishop Desmond Tutu sadly died and we have taken time to both celebrate his work and look for a new patron. I am delighted to report that Nomatemba "Thembi" Tambo has generously agreed to take up this role. There is no doubt that her background and beliefs will continue to inspire the work that BEFSA has endeavoured to carry out in some of the poorest communities in the Eastern Cape, South Africa, especially in the areas of supporting women in business creation and our work surrounding domestic violence. Here is her, very condensed, biography.

Nomatemba "Thembi" Tambo is the daughter of legendary anti-apartheid politician Oliver Reginald Tambo. She has previously served as the South African ambassador in Rome. She has also served as the head of the Tambo Foundation.

Ms Tambo received her BA in History and English at Roehampton Institute in London. This was followed by her LLB Post Grad Law at University of Witwatersrand in 2002. In 2007, she completed her diplomatic training.

She is the Director of both Women in Capital Growth (a black empowerment company) and Webnet Solutions. She is also the CEO of Evening Star Manufacturing. Since 2008 she has been involved in diplomatic work, between 2008 and 2012 she was the South African Consul General in Hong Kong.

She is also the Co-Founder of the South African Women's Chamber of Commerce as well as a member of the International Women's Forum.


