#### Letter from our Rector, Rev. Steve Stewart:



#### "Infamy, infamy! They've all got it in for me!"

The end of 2023 saw the death at 100 years of age of the political giant, Dr Henry Kissinger. A man of his time, whose political decisions and achievements will divide opinion, sometimes markedly so, now and for a long time of analysis to come. Kissinger sits in and alongside a constellation of other figures, from Kennedy to Castro and Mao to Mandela as one of the key political figures of the 20th century.

And when we look back over the span of history, whether we are considering Julius Caesar or Henry Kissinger, whatever their achievements, their time is seasonal and temporary – and even if their influence stretches forward into centuries like Julius Caesar and his adopted son Augustus, the one thing their influence can never touch is the past, the time before they were born!

# For each of these notable or notorious political giants, the jury will always be out as to whether they deserve fame or infamy.

Yet one historical figure stands apart: the carpenter's son Jesus of Nazareth. Firstly, no political figure past or present has ever had anything like his monumental, global influence. Jesus Christ is not only the shaper of empires – even eventually Rome itself, never mind the largest empire of all history, the British Empire – but of literature, music, art, philosophy and faith.

Jesus' influence goes even beyond the things of his time and future: in declaring his divinity, those who recorded his life and death and resurrection, proclaimed him as the author of *all* history since the beginning of creation. Nor are we speaking merely of *influence*, but of *kingship* from and into all eternity. No human being has ever had such claims taken seriously.

For all other historical figures, even Gandhi, even Mandela, none claimed or had argued for their perfection. But not so for Jesus Christ. Even his closest friends and confidantes, the Apostle Peter and the Apostle John were able to write, "he committed no sin and no deceit was found in his mouth" (1 Peter 2:22) and, "in him is no sin" (1 John 3:5).

Pundits in the schools of political history around the world may always look to compare Mao with Julius Caesar, Gandhi with Mandela, or Kissinger with Nixon. But for Jesus Christ there is no comparison with any other. He alone stands across *all* history, past, present, future and eternal, as *Deus Homo*, the divine and human, sinless, resurrected, reigning, Lord and Saviour. Only of Jesus Christ alone could anything like these claims be made seriously.



#### A VILLAGE DESIGN STATEMENT FOR FREELAND

With input from Freeland residents - Freeland Parish Council in conjunction with West Oxfordshire District Council (WODC) intend to explore the possibilities of producing our own Village Design Statement. (VDS)

When completed, this VDS would sit alongside the WODC Local Plan as a supplementary planning document bespoke to Freeland.

It would set out what we, as residents, feel about...OUR VILLAGE. What makes it special, unique or maybe what could be improved? So, when, or if development is proposed (from a modest extension to new dwellings) we have already thought long and hard about the things we value and the things we do not wish to see lost under the wheels of change.

A VDS would neither prevent nor encourage development but add a nuanced understanding of the implications development may have on our village. To that end, a VDS will need to be far reaching, to include History, Cartography, Landscape, Biodiversity, Hydrology, Climate change, Sustainability and Photography old & new, etc.

#### WHO WILL PROVIDE THE CONTENT?

Every resident will be consulted, every group from School to Church, Sports team to Allotment society.

A potential 12-month project will produce a booklet complete with maps/ text and photos; (for an example, visit 'Combe Village Design Statement', recently adopted by WODC)

#### FREELAND ENERGY GROUP

Freeland Energy Group plan to meet monthly on the third Monday of each month in the Newell Room. We are one of the working groups set up to support the Parish Council following the village's questionnaire response recognising a need for more advice and inspiration on becoming low-carbon.

Freeland is part of Eynsham CAP Zero a pilot project that contributes to the National NET Zero 2050 commitment. This project involves the local Parishes served in whole or in part by the electricity sub-station at the A40 junction. The Freeland Energy Group has adopted an action plan that was developed with neighbouring villages, who have been active in this area considerably longer than us, and the Oxford Low Carbon Hub. Several actions on the plan tie in with our village request for advice.





# Crocodiles of the World – Reptile Surveying of North Leigh Common.

Those local to North Leigh may have noticed small mats located around the Common since spring of this year. These 'refugia' sheets were put in place as part of a project set up staff at Crocodiles of the World earlier in the year to survey the reptile life at the common. By doing this, we were able to identify which species exist in the area and the habitats/areas they prefer. In the long-term, surveying projects such as this can help identify ways to manage the environment to help conserve those native reptiles within.

#### Refugia surveying - how does it work?

Refugia refers to artificial refuges that can attract reptiles by absorbing heat and providing shelter from predators. They have long and successfully been used an as an aid for reptile surveying. North Leigh Common is a popular dog walking area, so we wanted to make sure our chosen refugia mats were dog and child-friendly also, i.e., with no sharp edges. We chose a variety of materials including roofing felt, carpet and corrugated organic bitumen sheets.

#### What we did

We placed 30 refugia sheets around the common and carried out surveys twice weekly, recording all reptiles found under, on top of, or nearby the sheets. We also recorded weather conditions as this can influence survey findings. Such factors can then let us explore activity levels (e.g. times of day they are most active, preferred temperatures) and determine if there are any seasonal movement of reptiles.

#### What we found

Surveying showed us that North Leigh Common is absolutely teeming with wildlife! In the summer months, it wasn't uncommon to find animals under at least half of the sheets. Regular reptile residents included an abundance of slow worms, common lizards and fewer, but regular grass snakes. We were also lucky enough to uncover the occasional great crested newt not too far from their seasonal ponds. Being semi-aquatic, it's not uncommon for newts to be out of water, particularly before, or at the end of the breeding season.

We carried out some pond checks by torch earlier in the year and found them to be heaving with the stunning great crested newts. Common toads and frogs are also prevalent in and around the seasonal ponds towards the south of the site.

#### Reptiles - Who lives where?

Slow worms showed a huge preference for a long shallow gulley just away from the grassland where vegetation was a little thicker. We'd often find multiple slow worms warming up together under one sheet. The common lizards preferred sunnier spots

where the main grassland bordered the surrounding scrub. Log benches situated in these sunny areas were inundated with baby lizards throughout the summer. They favoured these benches so much that we had the pleasure of watching them grow from week to week! Grass snakes on the other hand were found a little more sporadically spread around the common but we did see one set up camp for the summer under its favourite sheet, located well away from the footpaths.

#### **Community Day**

We also hosted a community day on the site in August once the project was well underway. The day was well received, and we had the pleasure of chatting with many local residents about what we were doing on the site. We were able to demonstrate how to survey for reptiles and we were even able to point out plenty of native reptiles in their natural environment. The confident young lizards were again a big hit, running around for all to enjoy!

#### What's next?

The data we've collected will allow us to produce a reptile and amphibian species list of North Leigh Common and identify preferred habitat for those more abundant reptiles. We are also interested in when the animals become active in the area, and when the season ends (when they all disappear to hibernate).

Ongoing management in the area takes place at various times of the year. This may include grass cutting and scrub management such as bracken removal. We hope to examine the effects these activities on the resident reptiles, if any. We'll then be able recommend if any adjustments need to be made to the management of the site that best suits both the wildlife, and public use of the land.

You may have heard people say, or even said yourself when asked what kind of white wine you like: "ABC - anything but chardonnay!"

Chardonnay has a bad reputation due to the cheap, mass-produced, heavily-oaked varieties produced in the 80's and 90's - whilst they are still out there, there are many other types to try. 

### FREELAND CRICKET CLUB

The club held its Annual General Meeting on the 5th December. Below is a shorter version of my annual report.

#### Reflection of the Club's Progress

The AGM offers a chance to review and renew, learning from the past and making changes for the future.



In 2012 the men's league team folded because there was insufficient members, as all of the juniors had left because of a lack of opportunity to play at a level they could succeed in.

Between 2010 and 2017 the junior section grew and grew, which encouraged the former members to return to play in the village, and we re-started the adult league team in 2018.

In 2019, to reflect the growth of women's and girls' cricket, we started the women's section. Initially with only softball, but we entered the hardball development league in 2020, and in 2022 we entered the II-a-side Home Counties league, combining with Eynsham CC under the West Oxfordshire Warriors banner.

In those 13 years we have grown from 10 playing members to 125, this is truly amazing for such a small village.

We have been lucky, we have had several volunteers who have assisted in coaching and running teams, Graham, Peter, John, David, Richard, Emma and Ric. Behind the scenes we have been guided by Paul Salway, in his role as secretary, making sure we do things properly, and Linda Day as our league umpire.

I would like to personally thank those named above, and the committee members, the captains, all the parents, volunteers and the players for their contributions.

- Investment in new machinery for the pitch
- Attracted 6 new adult Cherwell league players
- Grew every section of the club
- More juniors played cricket
- 2 newly qualified coaches

- Continued to be financially supported by the parish council, our sponsors and grants from the ECB


