Letter from our Curate:

Dear Friends.

Each July, the Samaritans run their 'Talk to us' campaign, raising awareness that they are here for anyone who needs someone to listen, 24/7, without judgment or pressure. The Samaritans are not a religious organisation, but they were founded by a vicar called Chad Varah, in 1953 in London. A month later, the Daily Mirror coined the phrase 'Telephone Good Samaritan', referring to the story Jesus told about a man who went out of his way to help a stranger.

Chad knew that the service would only work if people knew about it. We all have up and down days. It is ok not to be ok. But we never have to face anything alone. There is always someone we can talk to. As a Christian, I believe that nothing - not barriers or isolation or social distancing, or rulers or powers, or the present, or things to come, can separate us from the love of God. We can always bring our concerns, no matter how small, to God in prayer.

If you are having a difficult time, you can contact the Samaritans about anything that's troubling you, no matter how large or small the issue feels. You can also call them if you are worried about someone else. And as your parish church, we are also here for you - do be in touch with them, or with us if you would like someone to talk to.



FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL - LISA'S NOTES JUNE 2020

Virtual Parish Council Meeting

The Parish Council held its first 'virtual' meeting via Zoom on Monday 15th June at 7.30pm. We had one member of the public present and everything went well with no major technical difficulties which was somewhat of a relief!! For the foreseeable future all Parish Council meetings will be held in this way until legislation changes to allow meetings in person.

The virtual meeting also included the Annual Meeting of the Council, where Peter Newell was re-elected to serve as Chairman for the coming year, and Robert Crocker was also re-elected as Vice-Chairman.

The next virtual Parish Council meeting will be held on **Monday 20th July at 7.30pm** via Zoom. If any members of the public wish to join the meeting, a link will be posted on the village website (under Parish Council/Agendas) and on the village notice boards, or you can contact me at **lisa.fpc@gmail.com** to obtain the details.

Play equipment on playing field - still closed!

As current lockdown restrictions start to ease, at the time of writing these notes (17/06/20), all of the play equipment on the playing field still remains closed and therefore must not be used. Please do not allow children to use the equipment until it is safe to do so and the restrictions are lifted. Thank you!

The Parish Council have also decided to install 2 timber benches and an additional trampoline with some safety surfacing around them. These will be located by the large wooden climbing equipment near the zip wire. The Parish Council will also be installing some picnic tables by the Newell Room for residents' use.

41 house development on A4095 by Mears Homes

The Parish Council have been advised that building work has been stopped at the Mears Homes site on the A4095. We are currently trying to find out whether the site will be completed or what will be happening and I will keep you updated as soon as I know anything further. Our District Councillor, Merilyn Davies, is also working to find out any updates about if and when the site will be finished. Some good news is that \$106 funds from this development have been received by WODC, which will be passed to the County Council so that a new bus shelter can be built on the A4095.

Coronavirus - an update

As lockdown restrictions start to ease, we will be reviewing the prescription service currently being offered to our residents. This was always set up as a temporary arrangement, put in place as an emergency measure to help our most vulnerable residents during the Covid 19 lockdown. At the moment we will still be running the prescription service until the end of July, at which point we will review how things are going with a view to reduce/cease the service at some point. My thanks once again to all of our volunteers who have helped during this time, your help has been invaluable and made the service offered possible and I know it has been very much appreciated by those who have made use of it. I realise also that there have been many other people who volunteered their services who we haven't contacted to help out. The simple truth is that we had way more volunteers than we needed!! We ended up with over 120



WI Climate Advisor Tips from Rosie Smith.

Tip I) Plant a tree for CO₂ absorption

Whilst it is much better to reduce carbon emissions, planting is a great way to help sequester carbon emissions. Through photosynthesis trees absorb carbon dioxide to produce oxygen and wood. By ensuring that the trees planted are native broad leaf species you can help to preserve the UK's environment and biodiversity. If you have the space to do this in your own garden then do it or you can fund an organisation to plant trees on your behalf such as: The Woodland Trust:

Tip 2) Plant a tree for shade and wind protection

EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP UPDATE

We continue to adapt our services to meet the needs of our patients more effectively, especially during these extraordinary times and would like to thank the community for being patient and understanding with all of the changes we have introduced recently.

New systems were being devised prior to Covid-19 and it was decided that it would be suitable to roll them out during the pandemic. The new system means that patients will only be coming to the surgery if absolutely necessary, therefore reducing footfall to the surgery and risk to staff and patients alike.

<u>eConsult</u> This is a feature on our website (www.eynshammedicalgroup.org.uk) where you can submit your medical enquiry and it will be reviewed by a clinician and responded to within 24 working hours. We highly recommend this option as our lines are busier than usual and we may have fewer members of staff available to answer calls in the coming months with the continuing situation. You can still phone the surgeries on: Long Hanborough 01993 881330 or Eynsham 01865 881206.

Doctor's appointments will be bookable <u>on the day</u>. If you need medical advice you can call to speak to a patient care advisor as normal and we will book a telephone appointment initially. The clinician will then call you that day and if it is necessary to see you at the surgery face to face, they will arrange this with you on the call. We believe this gives greater flexibility and access to your GP.

Currently we are asking patients attending the surgery to wear a facemask. We ask that you wear your own but if you cannot, please speak to the front desk upon arrival. Masks are not required for dispensary visits.

Eynsham Medical Group would again like to say thank you for all of the support and donations we've received. We have been fortunate that we've had volunteers delivering prescriptions, medications and assessment packs, to and from the surgeries, for patients who have been shielding. This has been a smooth operation and aided us to continue treating patients at higher risk. We commend the local communities on the 'rallying together' we've witnessed. We've received donations of PPE, wash bags and facemasks from a great number of members of the community including local businesses. These have helped us more than you will know.

Dispensary updates:

You need to allow <u>7 calendar days</u> before collecting an ordered repeat prescription. <u>Do not</u> attend early or come to the surgery before the 7 days as we need to reduce footfall to the surgery in line with the Government's rules on social distancing.

Long Hanborough: Monday - Friday: 9.00am - 1.00pm and 2.00pm - 6.00pm. Late night opening Wednesday until 6.30pm.

Eynsham: Monday - Friday: 9.00am - 12.00noon and 3pm - 6pm. Late night opening Wednesday until 6.30pm.

Dispensary calls are only taken between **10.30am** and **12.00noon**; during this time you will be able to speak to one of our dispensary staff. Alternatively, you may leave a message 24 hours a day on one of our dispensary numbers:

Please note that from <u>August</u>, we will be changing the hours for taking calls to between **2.30pm and 4.30pm.**



COMBE MILL - TRASH OR TREASURE

Reproduced here is the photo that has got us all excited at the Mill. It has been kindly gifted to our collection by a local historian in Long Hanborough. Someone gave her a box of papers from an elderly relative and she has been busy sorting through the contents, it could have quite easily been thrown away but she recognised that it could be a photo of Combe Mill.

It will now be catalogued by the archivist team to be added officially to the Mill's collection. This is a really important process for our status as a museum and of course our ability to share knowledge with locals and visitors from further afield.

The photo shows several clues to the date of its capture - firstly a very tall chimney stack can be seen. This tells us the photo was taken before July 1924, when the chimney was demolished at a cost of £9-0s-4d.

The chimney stack was partly rebuilt in the 1970's by Jeff Bloxham who had lived at the Mill as a boy in the 1930s and 1940s, and was one of the group of enthusiasts who took

on restoration of the site. This information is within our archive already, along with some photos of the various people who worked at the Mill in the past. In the original we see a person in a bowler hat who is obviously very important and we believe that this is either Edward Nash, who was Clerk of Works between 1884 and 1905, or Archie Dunkley who followed after him.



Once we reopen we will be able to match the men in the photos we have with this new find. The job would be to oversee the day to day working of the Mill. The bell turret that we can still see today was there when the photo was taken, but hidden behind the chimney. We can also see the size of the trees that the Mill was able to cut at this time. The building on the left, housed some very large machinery and saws, this building now houses Jack Brunsdon's. The uniqueness of the photo is that it shows the original direction of the leet, the water course that actually made the water wheel turn. The leet was filled in during the 1960's, included in the filling were old cars amongst other things and this is now the car park area. We don't have any photos in our archive showing the water course as it used to be and therefore this photo will be proudly displayed in the foreman's office when the Mill reopens.

It just goes to show you what treasure lies in small boxes of old stuff, that may have ended up as trash, but saved with a little care for others and attention to local historical information.

FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

Not many months ago I was commenting on how much rain we had had and that many areas were flooded. We probably thought there would be no hosepipe ban this summer.

However our parched gardens are now desperate for rain and though some may be expected, it often passes our area by! We have been saving every scrap of water from the kitchen and carrying it down to the vegetables. They don't seem to mind washing up water or soap suds, in fact they could act as an insecticide. We do not have a ban yet but many of us are reluctant to use hosepipes so that we conserve our precious water. Remarkably many plants have coped well with the parched soil and just get on with their growth.

Many more of us have been out in our gardens recently particularly with more time at home. Encourage your children and grandchildren to join in as well. They love planting seeds, watering and seeing them grow and maybe eating the produce. They may like to make a bug hotel or to make pots out of newspaper.

The RHS has given many tips for gardeners in their magazine. I will include a few here: Cut down perennial flowers after flowering in the spring. Tie climbing plants to supports. Deadhead your roses by cutting the spent flowers off with secateurs to the next pair of leaves. Prune spring flowering shrubs.

If you grow soft fruit net it to keep the birds off. Train the leader shoot of tomatoes to a support and remove all side shoots. Harden off plants in the greenhouse for planting out. Sow fast growing crops in between other vegetables to use up all the available space.

Conserve water by standing your pots in a tray of water. Water plants at their roots not over the foliage and water in early morning or in the evening. Give plant a really good soak occasionally rather than a little frequently. Try not to use synthetic fertilisers, use garden compost, well rotted manure as a mulch, home soaked comfrey, or seaweed fertiliser. Check your plants regularly for pests and diseases. Aphids on roses can be hand removed, squash red lily beetles (if you can catch them) and watch for drooping plants which may have vine weevils in the soil. Mow your lawn less often, We hope you find some of these tips useful.

At present there is no news of when we can hold Club meetings again, but situations change day by day so we wait in hope! The Committee will discuss what to do about next year's subs and forthcoming events.

We are very grateful to Tim Webster and his staff for arranging a safe way to enter the Nursery, choose plants, pay and exit. The initial rush to buy plants seems to have now subsided and usually there is no longer a long queue to get in. I am sure he has been glad of our custom.

We wish all Freeland residents a safe passage through this unusual time and hope they and their families keep well.

FARMING WITH NATURE - Farm Diary - May 2020

The May blossom (Hawthorne) has been spectacular on our big hedges.

Calving has gone well with all calves born within an eight-week period. We sadly lost one calf - a detached placenta caused the calf to die during the early stages of labour but then, our last cow to calve (on 3rd May) delivered identical twin bull calves. The mother has a very placid nature and as the first calf staggered to its feet and suckled, she continued to lick it clean whilst standing to deliver the second. Twins can be a mixed blessing as it is better to have one strong calf than two weedier specimens but, in this case, both are strong and will soon work-out how to sneak a top up of milk from another unsuspecting mum.

Farmers are rarely satisfied with the weather and despite the glorious sunshine, for May It has been far too hot, too cold, too windy and...too dry. The cows are quickly consuming, not only the grazing pastures, but those normally cut for winter forage. The spring sown cereals have received only one day's rain since emerging and none at all in May. With no rain forecast for early June, it is looking worrying.

In early May the cuckoo sang his heart out for two weeks before moving on.

Whilst quietly mending a broken section of fence, I was able to observe a Pied Woodpecker feeding her voracious chicks. Alighting upon the trunk of a slim poplar tree, every two minutes or so, with more feed, she puts her head into the hole to a rapturous response from the chicks.

Before cattle can leave the farm to be sold to another farm or market, they have to be tested for TB to ensure they are not carrying the infection. With TB still rife in our area, there is always the possibility of a reactor but happily, the store cattle (last year's calves) all test negative and so are ready to be transported to their new home at JCB Farms in Shropshire. At just over a year old, these animals will take a further 18 months to fatten as finished Organic beef. At this point our beef may well return to the Daylesford Farm Shop at Kingham.

A practical improvement to the Farmyard has proved a big hit with the swallows. To intercept any run-off from the yards in winter, we have dug two interconnecting ponds. With an interceptor pit to strain out any solids, the water then passes through reed beds until purified. But, for now, the open expanse of water is perfect for swallows to skim across, catch insects and drink. Their aerial display is mesmerising.

As I check the cows and calves in the early morning, the hedgerows and oak trees are alive with fledglings...Blue Tits, Great Tits, Nut Hatches, Hedge sparrows and Woodpeckers (to name but a few) The sweet scent from the Elderberry flowers and honeysuckle fills the air and, with humidity so low, it feels more like mid-summer than May. It's wonderful, but I wish it would rain!

I will continue with my rain dance as the longest day draws close.


