Letter from our Curate:

Dear Friends,

At this time of year, spring is just starting to blossom all around us - including one of my favourite flowers, Hellebores (sometimes known as the lenten rose). I always think they look so shy, with their beautiful heads slightly dipped. They herald the ending of winter and the coming of spring - a promise of the new life that is yet to come, with the warmer weather.

The joy that these flowers bring reminds me of God's beautiful creation. I was reading earlier this year the writing of St Francis Borgia, who was a nobleman who became a Jesuit priest and monk after his wife sadly died. He writes:

On Sunday 9th February, our Rector, David Tyler, took his last service in our Benefice at St Peter and St Paul's in Church Hanborough. The previous week saw David's last service in Freeland at a very well-attended family service in St. Mary's. Over the past twelve and a half years he has served the parishes of Freeland and Hanborough, looking after our four churches and all its parishioners, many of which

joined David and his family in a farewell celebratory tea party in Freeland Village Hall on Sunday afternoon.

David, who in January was made an Honorary Canon in a service at Christ Church Cathedral in Oxford, not only has served as our Rector since 2007, but was also the Assistant Archdeacon of Dorchester and had twice acted as Area Dean of Woodstock, not to mention his time as a governor at both Manor School in Long Hanborough and Freeland School. He now leaves us to take up a new permanent role as Associate Archdeacon of Dorchester and will soon be moving to the south of the county to take up the new position.

I believe we were truly blessed when God led David and his lovely family to our parish, and it is with a heavy heart that the time has come to say farewell. I personally don't want to lose David as our Rector. I have valued his leadership, his patience and his friendship, but God has opened a new path to him and I rejoice in this for David as he takes the next steps in his lifelong ministry. I therefore can only give thanks to God for David's work and everything he has done for me, my family and the wider community during his ministry. We have been truly blessed.

Although they are two very simple words, on behalf of the many people I have personally spoken to, 'Thank you' Rev. Canon David Tyler and may God bless you, Catherine, Josh, Charlotte and Poppy as you embark on the next chapter.



Annual Parish Meeting

All residents are welcome so please make a note of the date and come along if you can. The Council are thinking of "going green" this year, so a number of environmentally themed topics are likely to be covered, plus ideas will be sought from parents regarding replacing a piece of play equipment in the toddler play area. Further details will follow next month.

Little Free Library

Some new vinyl signs will be attached to the phone box shortly (they will probably have been done by the time this Grapevine is printed!) and then the new Little Free Library will be up and running! Matthew will be advising further on this, but in the meantime the Council would like to thank Matthew for his work on getting this project completed.

Parish Council Elections - 7th May 2020

2020 is an election year! Would you like to become more involved in your village but are unsure how to? Becoming a Parish Councillor is a great place to start! Freeland Parish Council elections are due to be held on **Thursday 7**th **May 2020** and there are 8 places on Freeland Parish Council. If only 8 candidates stand it will be an uncontested election, if more than 8 people stand than it will be contested and a poll will take place on the **7**th **May**.

I will be receiving nomination papers shortly from the District Council which I hope to make available via the village website or they can be collected from me (or you can contact me directly and I can arrange to pop one through your door).

I would strongly encourage anyone wishing to get more involved in their village to consider joining the Parish Council, it's a great way to have your say and make a real difference to your community.

compaction and improve drainage. The Parish Council have therefore agreed to have verti-draining work carried out, and this will be done when conditions allow to ensure the best results are achieved.

The Parish Council are also currently working on providing a new picnic bench on the field and extending the safety surfacing around it, plus replacing the old garage with a new larger storage shed that can house the tractor, mower and other sports equipment for the Football and Cricket Clubs. Quotes are currently being obtained.

Daffodils

As advised last month, the lovely daffodil bulbs are now starting to push through ready to display their beautiful bright cheery yellow flowers. These bulbs have been lovingly planted by members of the Gardening Club and every year the flowers make a fantastic display throughout the village. Please be mindful that the bulbs are particularly vulnerable whilst they are coming through, so please keep off the grass verges where they have been planted. Thanks very much.

Salt bins

As the weather turns colder, just a reminder that there are a number of salt bins provided in the village for residents to use on their driveways/paths etc should we get any snow/ice. The salt bins are located outside of the Primary School (next to the post box), by the hill near no. 42 Wroslyn Road, and by the Village Hall.

Speedwatch

Confirmation has been received from Thames Valley Police that they have changed their policy regarding acceptable equipment to be used by Speedwatch teams and that the Bushnell gun was now acceptable. The original Freeland Speedwatch team has therefore been reformed and Speedwatch activity is now being carried out once again. The Parish Council wish to pass on their thanks to the Speedwatch team whose work was felt to be an active deterrent to speeding motorists.

FARMING WITH NATURE - AN INTRODUCTION

For centuries, farming and nature enjoyed a symbiotic relationship. Every farmer, by default, a conservationist. The pace of farming allowed nature to adapt and thrive but now, things are very different. Our natural world is under threat from decades of industrialisation and our indifference to the delicate, natural balance that once existed. Intensive farming has played an undeniable part in the demise of our wildlife. Through the 1960s and 1970s wholesale removal and fragmentation of habitats, indiscriminate use of crude pesticides and artificial fertilisers initially set in motion, a collapse of many species. Most of the early chemicals have long since been withdrawn from use. Practices such as aerial application of fertilisers and sprays out-lawed and straw burning banned.

Today's modern farmer has the benefit of hindsight and realises the enormous challenge of feeding a nation whilst being custodian of the natural world. A healthy ecosystem is the by-product of good farming practice and yet our wildlife continues to decline.

Although farming today is more sophisticated, with applications of chemicals and fertilisers carefully targeted, the sheer scale and speed of operations gives nature little chance to adapt and evolve to this new world. Monoculture creates vast deserts of no-go areas and wildlife is pushed to the margins.

Today, for most modern farmers, the management of the wildlife that inhabits our farms, biodiversity, healthy soils, field margins, hedgerows and clean water are as important as our crops and animals. Profit can no longer be at the expense of nature.

A monthly summary of a farm diary will give some insight in to the interaction between the farming operations and the natural world. The January diary is on **page 35.** I farm a 600-acre mixed farm, situated between Freeland, Long & Church Hanborough and Eynsham.





FARMING WITH NATURE - Farm Diary - January 2020

Ultimately, everything revolves around the weather and what weather we have had. 2019 ended with three and a half months of rain and the new decade has yet to see any change.

The calves, aged 9 to 10 months, have now been weaned from their mothers. Our Aberdeen Angus cows produce one calf per year and the cow's dual purpose in life is to suckle their calf whilst grazing and maintaining our biodiverse pastures. Their presence, as an Organic herd, supports a raft of wildlife. During the winter, they are housed in open strawed yards; producing much needed manure...they are my fertiliser factory! Ensuring that the soil is replenished with nutrients and organic matter. From the worms to the insects, to the birds (who pluck the cows moulting hair to line their nests) these munching ruminants keep the eco system healthy whilst preserving the carbon sink pastures.

My vet gives good news, that his ultra-sound scanner confirms all bar one cow is in calf...well done bulls! Gestation is similar to that of humans. The bulls join the cows on lune 2^{nd} (my birthday) and the first calves of the year will be born in early March.

The cattle yards are frequented by numerous birds in winter, feeding on the tiny seeds that fall from the opened hay bales, the timber slats in the hay barn allow easy access to a safe, warm roost.

Whilst walking across the waterlogged fields towards Eynsham, on my way to inspect the water level of a newly constructed pond, I see that the Pied Wagtails have already claimed it as their own. It will be interesting to see which other species colonise the pond this year.

Flocks of linnet rise from the oat stubble and descend into one of the many large hedges whilst a small murmur of starlings perform their aerial display before roosting.

We grow only spring sown cereals which, after the wet autumn just passed, is a blessing. My neighbours have struggled to establish autumn sown crops.

The overwintered stubble harbours many insects and, being Organic, also harbours many weeds. Amongst them, on the lighter patches, is Speedwell...the earliest plant to flower and set seed. Speedwell is a lifesaver for small birds, when other sources of winter food are exhausted.

February beckons, the nights are noticeably drawing out and, as twilight descends, two Pied Woodpeckers hammer out their last reverberating message of the day. See an A-Z of UK birds at: www.rspb.org.uk/birds-and-wildlife/wildlife-guides/bird-a-z/

Many WI campaigns have concerned the environment. The WI is a founding member of the Climate Coalition (**www.climatecoalition.org**), which is the UK's largest group of people dedicated to action against climate change. As part of our local commitment to environmental awareness and action, Rosie Smith continues to provide us with practical tips and ideas on reducing our personal environmental impact:

Reduce your use of a washing machine – Spot clean clothes rather than automatically putting them in the washing machine. So if there is just a small mark or stain on an item of clothing, wash just that mark or stain, rather than taking the easy option of just throwing it in the machine. Saves you money as well.

Ditch the Cling film (not strictly climate change mitigation, but a good idea anyway as anything that reduces unnecessary manufacturing helps). Use reusable beeswax paper to wrap food in the fridge. Put food in plastic boxes with lids, rather than cover with cling film. Buy some reusable dish covers, they look a bit like shower caps but are very useful and reusable.


