#### EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP UPDATES EXCESSIVE WAITING IN THE PHONE QUEUE

The Practice is aware of the problem and are working hard to get it resolved. It is mainly a staffing issue with Patient Care Advisors (PCAs) taking unnecessary calls from patients regarding the covid vaccination and needing to contact those for whom booking on line is not an option. They are working on prioritising answering the phones by assigning roles within the PCA group and of increasing the number of staff they have, although this second task will obviously take time to become effective.

Things are not easy at the moment so please be as patient as you can.

#### Next stage in First Dose vaccination against Covid-19

The Government has announced that the Practice can now start vaccinating the next cohort of 45 - 49 year olds.

You will be contacted by text or phone when it is your turn so <u>please do not call the</u> surgery about this.

#### **BOOKING IN FOR A SECOND COVID VACCINE DOSE - IMPORTANT**

There is one thing that is important with regard to booking vaccine appointments on-line. If the Practice has a mobile phone number for you, they will send you a text message when it is time for your second dose of the vaccine. That message will contain a link code which, when clicked, will take you to the **NHSApp** where you can log-in. Once logged-in, you can move to the appointments section. It is here that you need to be very careful to book the right type and location for the vaccine. There have been many incidences of the **NHSApp** trying to get you to book an incorrect vaccine and at locations far, far away. Neither the **NHSApp** nor the **Patient Access (EMISS)** apparently has "knowledge" of what vaccine you had for the first dose and does not generally "know" where you had it.

These shortcomings are not the fault of the Practice and is not something they can control or change. It is still far better to book on-line and exercise some care when doing so otherwise the Practice phone systems would go into meltdown and make obtaining an appointment very, very difficult.

Using **Patient Access** https://www.patientaccess.com is most likely a better option at present as it is generally easier to use and will more often offer an appropriate appointment.

However, here is some advice that you may find useful:

• Do not try to book an appointment before being contacted by the surgery by text or by phone. If an on-line system grants you an appointment before being contacted, it is unlikely you will be given the vaccine on arrival. In any case, receiving the second dose ahead of its due time may possibly reduce its effectiveness.

• Your second dose of vaccine must be the same type and given at the same location as you received your first dose. That could have been at Long Hanborough, the Windrush in Witney, the Kassam – or another location.

• If an on-line booking system will only allow you to book an inappropriate appointment, do not accept it. **In that situation, and in that situation only**, phone the Long Hanborough surgery and explain the situation to them so it can be resolved.

#### FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

All our members will be very sorry to hear that Jill and Ray Evans are having to give up the Club due to Ray's ill health. Together they have been an enormous part of the Gardening Club since it started and it is partly due to their continuing hard work that the Club has been so successful. We shall miss them very much and do send them our best wishes for better health soon.

The Committee will meet before long to discuss the future. We shall be needing some new Committee members, so if you are interested to join us please contact Terry Jones on **davidjones30@talktalk.net** 

There is still no news of when the Club will meet again, but hopefully it won't be too far in the future.

The daffodils along Wroslyn Road and at the Green have been better than ever. The next spectacular show is the bluebells in Vincents Wood. If you have never been to see them, go down to the Green bear left and follow the track down to the wood beyond the gate. From the middle of April they are usually at their best.

Some of the jobs that can be done at this time of year are as follows:-

Dead head spring bulbs and feed the greenery with either a liquid feed or granules. Don't be tempted to cut leaves off or tie them over but only remove them when they die off as they feed the bulbs for next year. Divide large clumps of snowdrops and replant smaller clumps around the garden. If other bulbs haven't done very well this year maybe they are overcrowded and need dividing too.

Plant annual flower seeds and prick out in trays when plants are big enough. Wash seed trays in warm soapy water first. Keep under cover till risk of frost has passed then plant out where you want them to flower. Plant a patch of wildflowers for the bees and other insects. Watch out for aphids, put on a pair of gloves and squash them as soon as you see them. Refresh long term pots by scraping off a layer of compost and refilling the pot with fresh compost.

Divide clumps of perennials that have got too big. Clean greenhouse glass to let in as much light as possible. Plant out sweetpea seedlings and keep well watered. In the veg garden plant seed potatoes when risk of frost is over. Either grow seeds or buy veg plants from the garden centre. Cabbage and brussels sprouts and other brassicas need a long growing period.

Feed rhubarb and if you want early stems cover the plants with a bucket etc. Cut off all old leaves from strawberry plants and give the plants a feed.

Get the earlies runner beans by placing seeds on damp kitchen paper till they begin to sprout then plant in pots and keep under cover till ready to plant out.


#### FREELAND WI

#### NORTH LEIGH ROMAN VILLA - East End OX29 6PZ

Set within a peaceful landscape on the banks of the River Evenlode, North Leigh Roman Villa is considered to be one of the largest villas in Roman Britain with a 500 year history of occupation. At its most extensive in the early 4th century AD it included 3 bath suites, 16 mosaic floors and 11 rooms with under-floor heating.

Today visitors can imagine the villa's former richness as they walk through the rectangular footprint of its walls – but the mosaic house hides the real gem of a near complete mosaic floor. The mosaics form the floor of villa's winter dining room and, as the only example in Oxfordshire still found in their original location, they give a powerful sense of the Villa's original opulence.

The mosaics have not been on regular display to the public since the early 1990s, but it is hoped to have some Open Days this summer, as in 2020. Please keep an eye on the website for further details:

As well as North Leigh Roman Villa, English Heritage cares for over 400 historic buildings, monuments and sites - from world-famous prehistoric sites to grand medieval castles, from Roman forts on the edge of the empire to a Cold War bunker. Through these, it brings the story of England to life for over 10 million people each year.

Recently North Leigh Roman Villa Volunteers were awarded a **Commendation** by the Heritage Alliance for outstanding heritage voluntary work in 2020. The collective efforts of the group of 25 committed local people worked to promote North Leigh's Villa site as a resource for well-being and education throughout the pandemic. This was judged to be a perfect example of where English Heritage volunteers have made a massive difference to linking heritage sites with their community during the pandemic.


During the summer of 2020, the volunteers led a series of successful Open Mosaic Days, hosting over 1,250 visitors which is nearly twice as many as the previous year. Visitors generously donated nearly **£1,000** to benefit the site, and in spite of covid

restrictions, the team of volunteers gave over 1000 hours of their time, including 290 on site in 2020.

#### EYNSHAM AND LONG HANBOROUGH MEDICAL CARE GROUP PATIENT CHARITY IS 25 YEARS OLD

The charity was set up in 1996 to administer the gifts and bequests the Eynsham and Long Hanborough medical centres receive from grateful patients and their loved ones.

Thanks to their generosity and the fund-raising efforts of local institutions like Eynsham Roadrunners and philanthropic organisations like the Rotary Club and Freemasons, for more than a quarter of a century it has enabled the trustees, drawn from present and past doctors, staff and representatives of the communities it serves, to offer extras the National Health Service does not.

Its first purchases were a resuscitation training doll and a syringe driver so doctors and district nurses could provide more effective pain relief for terminally ill patients. Among its more recent - during Covid - were clinicians' half masks for doctors and staff, who found patients had difficulty hearing them wearing the standard issue full masks or caused problems for those wearing glasses.

To give you an idea of the range of its activities, it has been responsible for air conditioning the waiting rooms at the practice's Eynsham and Long Hanborough surgeries, 24-hour blood pressure monitors, 24-hour electrocardiograms to monitor heart rhythms, defibrillators, hydraulic height adjustable couches, pulse oximeters to measure oxygen levels, a phlebotomy couch, an interactive website, and in 2019, thanks to the generosity of Eynsham Masonic Lodge, a vein viewer to help phlebotomists with patients who are difficult to draw blood from.

Advances in digital technology mean there is a constant demand for new aids to help with patient care. But since 2010 the major call on the charity's resources has been a van and part-time driver to deliver prescriptions to the house-bound, a service made possible by a substantial bequest.


