Letter from our Associate Rector, Rev. Mike Madden:

Dear Friends,

'He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:7-8)

I hesitate to call the green patch of land outside our back door a *'lawn'* because in truth it is more weeds than grass, but it is green, and it is large enough to kick a ball around when the weather is fine. Despite being predominately made up of weeds it does need cutting every now and then. This usually starts with the first cut of the year in March or April, when I dust down our old petrol mower which pulls me up and down the lawn as I gently guide and push from behind.

One year the first cut of the year seemed harder than usual, the lawnmower felt like a dead weight. Nevertheless, I persevered and finished the job, despite being completely exhausted. Each time I cut the grass it seemed to get harder and harder, and I got more and more exhausted. In fact, cutting the grass became so exhausting I began to ask myself questions such as "Am I am getting too old to do this?" or "Am I ill and should I go and see the doctor?" A few weeks later when the lawn mower came back from its annual service, I found out that the belt that drove the wheels had been broken and that I had been literally pushing that heavy lawnmower up and down our garden for weeks in my own strength no wonder I found it exhausting. Once the drive belt had been fixed it was so much easier to cut the grass.

Just like I failed to realise that I was cutting my grass under my own power, it is all too easy for us a Christians to live lives without the power of the Holy Spirit. As Christians we can easily become disconnected from God's power for our lives. The Father does not want us to live the Christian life in our own strength, but rather in the power of the Holy Spirit as promised by Jesus in Acts 1:7-8 (see above quotation) and fulfilled on the day of Pentecost in Acts 2. While we cannot all benefit from an annual service like my lawnmower, it is good nevertheless to pause and ask the Lord "Is this something you have called me to do, if so am doing it in your power or in my own strength?"

As we move from Easter towards Pentecost, my prayer for each one of us is that the Holy Spirit would so fill each of us with the love, the grace, and the power of God, that we would overflow with God's love, grace and power to everyone around us.





SPITFIRE HOMES – update

Background

Many of you will be aware that Spitfire Homes has submitted a planning application to build 80 houses on Chapel Meadow on the corner of Wroslyn Road and Pigeon House Lane. You can find it on the WODC planning portal, reference **22/03356/FUL**.

This is an opportunistic proposal following the battle with Inspired Villages on the opposite side of Wroslyn Road. Because land for housing in the area is currently below the Government-required 5-year supply level, this Birmingham-based developer (Spitfire Homes) has submitted a proposal that would normally be immediately refused – but that now stands a chance of getting through.

Many of us are in favour of an affordable housing supply to meet local needs. New families would bring benefits to the pub, garden centre and village school, and would boost overall village vitality. But this is not the proposal to achieve that because of:

- Irrevocable harm to the village landscape and character through, for example, closing the sensitive gap between the main part of the village and The Green. Elimination of a green space much loved by residents and dog walkers
- Increase in population of 13% and in traffic of around 30%
- Impact on a sensitive, biodiverse site and the loss of a key wildlife corridor
- Poor quality design which completely disregards local character and heritage.
- Inadequacy of local infrastructure capacity for schooling, medical care and sewage treatment

Where are we now?

A new group has been formed in the village, rather unimaginatively named "Friends of Freeland Two" (FF2), to fight this. You may have received a flyer from this group and seen various posters around the village. The response to the FF2 campaign has been tremendous, with 184 independent objections submitted by village residents. Freeland Parish Council (FPC) has also strongly objected to this application – their objection can be found on the FPC website **www.freelandpc.org.uk**.

The current owner of Chapel Meadow is Witney Town Charity, who sold a development option to Spitfire Homes several years ago. Both FPC and FF2 have now written to Witney Town Charity to point out the inappropriateness of Spitfire's application, and to appeal to their social conscience. To date they have refused to engage. Needless to say, it is very disappointing to see a local charity supporting a damaging development in order to raise money for projects elsewhere.

So what happens now?

At the time of writing, we understand that the WODC planning officer has recommended that the application be <u>refused</u>. She will present this recommendation to the Uplands Area Planning Sub-Committee on **Tuesday 25th April**. At the hearing, FPC and FF2 will each make a 3-minute presentation to support this refusal, and Spitfire's agent may make their pitch. The Planning Committee will then discuss the application, then vote on whether to approve or refuse it.

We sincerely hope the application will be refused, given the strength of opposition in the village. Continued......





We are so thankful for the strong support we have been shown in Freeland and Hanborough, and to our friends and family.



LITTLE FREE LIBRARY NEWS

Ever wondered how the Little Free Library movement began?

In 2009, Todd Bol, in Wisconsin, USA, built a model of a one room schoolhouse as a tribute to his mother (she was a teacher who loved to read). He filled it with books and put it on a post in his front garden; his neighbours and friends



loved it, so he built several more and gave them away.

Rick Brooks (a friend of Todd's) saw his DIY project while they were discussing potential social enterprises, and together, they saw opportunities to achieve a variety of goals. They were inspired by community gift-sharing networks and "take a book, leave a book" collections in coffee shops and public spaces.

In 2010, the name "Little Free Library" was formally established, and the purpose of these Little Free Library book exchanges became clear: to share books and bring communities together. By 2022, there were over 150,000 Little Free Libraries registered all over the world!

Freeland's Little Free Library was launched in 2015, outside 138 Wroslyn Road, with the support of a grant from WODC. Later, in 2020, The Teddy Girls funded the refurbishment of the disused telephone box outside the village hall, in partnership with the Parish Council, which allowed us to expand the Little Free Library to accommodate more books and to keep up with demand.

Thank you for your continued support; the Little Free Library has been more successful than we ever expected. Special thanks also to our amazing team of volunteers: Sue, Jenny, Fi and Caroline, who do a brilliant job sorting books and keeping everything tidy.

OXFORDSHIRE ELECTRIC VEHICLE CAR CLUB PILOT LAUNCHES

An Oxfordshire-wide pilot of electric vehicle (EV) car clubs has begun, with fourteen new car club EVs being launched across Abingdon, Banbury, Bicester, Eynsham, Henley, Kidlington, Oxford, Thame, Witney, Wallingford and Wantage. These shared vehicles – operated by CoWheels, Enterprise CarClub and Thame EV Hire Club - will be available for people to use on a pay-per-use basis. This provides a convenient and affordable alternative to individual car ownership, also an opportunity for petrol and diesel drivers to try an EV without any long-term commitment.

Oxfordshire County Council has coordinated the pilot and facilitated the arrangements between participating councils, car club operators and chargepoint operators. The EV car club vehicles will mainly be based at Park and Charge hubs in District Council car parks, and Oxford City Council are also introducing a new EV car club based at the Energy SuperHub at Redbridge Park and Ride.

Whilst car clubs have seen great success within Oxford, little has been tested outside of the City. The aim of this pilot project is to demonstrate the demand for car clubs in more urban and rural areas and test the business models for non-city EV car clubs. The hope is that if successful this pilot will help inform future EV car club roll-out strategy for the County and pave the way for more EV car clubs across Oxfordshire in the future. CHURCH HANBOROUGH 20mph SPEED LIMIT

Drivers will have noticed that the speed limit through Church Hanborough has been recently reduced from 30 to **20mph**.

This follows a number of consultation exercises that found the majority of residents supported such a change to improve road safety through the village.

The Church Hanborough Speedwatch Group has monitored traffic speeds before and after the change. Although it is very early days their preliminary findings indicate that the speed of

vehicles is decreasing. When the limit was 30mph speeds of up to 48mph were measured and this has now reduced to around 42mph. Before the 20mph limit was introduced around 25% of vehicles travelled above 35mph and now this figure is close to 17%. Hopefully as drivers become more aware of the speed limit change these figures will reduce even further, as will the number of vehicles exceeding the new reportable speed limit.

Increased driver awareness is crucial and so Hanborough Parish Council are considering the installation of a speed indication device to remind drivers on entry to Church Hanborough.

Don't let this be a wasted effort - please drive safe and keep others safe.

PHOTO ID REQUIRED FOR ELECTIONS FROM 4th MAY

Residents in West Oxfordshire District will need to show photographic ID to vote in person at this year's local elections which are being held on **Thursday 4th May**.

Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport; a UK, EEA or Commonwealth drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel passes, such as an older person's bus pass. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo and the name on the ID should be the same name as appears on the Electoral Register.

Anyone who does not have one of the accepted forms of ID will be able to apply for free ID online at **www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate** or by completing a paper form which is available from West Oxfordshire District Council at the Woodgreen office. If you need any help with applying for the free ID, or want to request an application form, contact the electoral services team on **01993 861410**.

More information is available on the West Oxfordshire District Council website (**www.westoxon.gov.uk**), including details of how to apply for the free ID. Anyone not able to visit the Council website, or apply for a Voter Authority Certificate online, is being encouraged to contact the Council as soon as possible and no later than the **5pm** deadline on **Wednesday 25 April**.

Anyone who wants to have their say in the elections this May must also be registered to vote. If you aren't already registered it only takes five minutes to register online at **www.gov.uk/register-to-vote**. Voters wishing to apply to their council for free ID should first make sure they are registered to vote.

The changes do not affect postal votes but do affect proxy voters who will be required to show their own valid ID when voting on behalf of someone else.

We will not be delivering the <u>general</u> patient Spring Booster campaign this year. This doesn't mean we won't be vaccinating from Long Hanborough again, it just means we are on hold until the Autumn.



All those registered to the Practice who are Housebound and/or in Care Homes will receive theirs from Community Nurses and other teams.

The NHS should contact you by post if you're eligible for a seasonal booster dose of the COVID-19 vaccine this spring.

- You may be offered a seasonal booster if you:
- are aged 75 or over (you need to have turned 75 on or before 30 June 2023)
- live in a care home for older adults
- are aged 5 or over and have a weakened immune system

Additional Covid Vaccination Information:



BLENHEIM

You may have noticed that our Lake Dredge has now been resumed after being paused for the past few months due to weather conditions. The dredging of Queen Pool first started back in April 2022, having not been carried out in over 100 years. Upon completion it will have removed 300,000 cubic metres of silt from our 'Capability' Brown designed lake – enough to fill Wembley Stadium. The dredge will return our lake to its original depth of two metres from its current shallows of 30cm. The walking loop around Queen Pool has once again been closed whilst the project is completed.



As the new season unfolds, you will soon begin to see signs of spring appear in the Parkland and surrounding areas. We have already seen a sprinkling of snowdrops, a blossoming of bluebells and drifts of daffodils with a whole host of other seasonal flowers still to come. To add to the Easter picture we will also see lambs arriving on the Estate this month. As we exclusively lamb outdoors, we ask all visitors to please be mindful of walking their dogs in the Parkland. Keeping your dog on a lead is particularly important to ensure that our sheep are not attacked or chased in a way that may cause injury, suffering or miscarriage.
