REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY SERVICE at ST MARY'S

There will be an outdoor Remembrance Day Service at St Mary's, Freeland on **Sunday 8th November** at **10.45am** in the Churchyard.

Letter from our Curate:

Dear friends,

This month I want to return to the theme of what it means to 'love our neighbours' that I initially began to explore in August earlier this year.

In Luke Chapter 10, when Jesus was asked by a lawyer "Who is my neighbour?" he answers by telling the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37). In telling this story, Jesus describes how a traveller was beaten, robbed and left for dead along the road. While the injured traveller was lying on the ground, a priest came by, but deliberately avoided the injured man. Later, a lawyer also came by, but he too avoided the wounded man by crossing to the other side of the road. Finally, a Samaritan came by who helped the injured man, in an act of mercy and compassion, despite the fact that the Samaritans were known as foreigners and long-term enemies of the injured man. So, when Jesus asked, "Which of these three do you think was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?", it was probably through gritted teeth that the lawyer mumbled, "The one who had mercy on him." To which Jesus replied, "Go and do likewise."

There is a great deal that we could learn from this parable told by Jesus, but three quick points are:

- We should love needy strangers, even foreigners The neighbour we are required to love is often not one we choose, but one that life and circumstances choose for us. The injured man and the Samaritan wouldn't have chosen each other as neighbours. Indeed, they became neighbours when one of them randomly experienced adversity, and the other decided to show compassion, even though it cost them time and money.
- We should show love to our actual next-door neighbours As G.K. Chesterton said, "We make our friends; we make our enemies, but God makes our next-door neighbours."
- Loving our neighbour in our families Just like our next-door neighbours, we did not choose our families, loving our neighbour in the context of our families can sometimes be challenging. Perhaps now is to time to rise to that challenge.

As we head towards the winter with growing Covid-19 infection rates and potentially stricter lockdowns, it would be easy to think we are powerless in the face of our current adversity. Whereas in reality, this simple but radical teaching of Jesus to love our neighbour, empowers us to change the circumstances of people's lives. These practical expressions of neighbourly kindness could be anything such as a donations to local food banks, going shopping on behalf of our next-door neighbours, ringing isolated members of our families, or simply wearing a facemask to protect others. Perhaps now more than ever is the time to show love and compassion to needy strangers and foreigners, next-door neighbours and our families.

FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL – LISA'S NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 21st SEPTEMBER 2020

New storage building on field

Many of you may have noticed the work taking place on the playing field in the far corner. This work is to erect a new metal storage building which can then be used to house the tractor and mower that were purchased last year, together with other sports equipment that are used by the Football and Cricket Clubs. This building is being funded by \$106 money that was obtained from the 41-house development on the A4095. It is anticipated that by the time you read this it will be completed. Work will then be carried out to slightly relocate the current footpath by Blenheim Lane so maintain access to the field in this corner.

Some shockwave treatment will also be carried out on the playing field shortly to help to improve the drainage. Every year the field floods quite badly in places and this then prevents the football club from using the field for their matches. Some verti-draining work was carried out earlier this year, and it is hoped that the shockwave treatment will also help to alleviate the flooding problems usually experienced.

New salt bin

A new winter salt bin has been ordered which will be placed by the village hall car park so that it can be used as required if we get a hard winter. It should hopefully be arriving in the next month.

Coronavirus - an update

As reported last month the central phone line **01993 651330** has now been cancelled and will no longer operate.

For anyone who is particularly worried about managing with prescription collections, please speak to the pharmacy on **01993 880351** to see if you can be put on their list for direct deliveries from them.

We have decided to keep the food bank going for the time being, so please continue to donate as and when you can (non-perishable goods only please).

Whilst we have no immediate plans to re-introduce the helpline, we are keeping things under constant review in line with Government advice and restrictions. Things are changing all the time so if restrictions get tighter and we feel the need to set up the helpline again, I will of course keep you informed.

We did a sponsored dance to raise money for a new climbing frame for the garden that we share with the foundation stage class at Freeland Primary School. The children all came in fancy dress.



FREELAND GARDENING CLUB

Autumn has definitely arrived and the spectacular variety of colours are wonderful. The beech trees in Blenheim should be in full colour soon.

In the garden it is a time for clearing beds of summer bedding and spent perennials and taking stock of any plants that have spread too far or that you no longer want. This leaves space to plant bulbs and spring bedding such as wallflowers. Planting while the soil is still relatively warm is a good time to give them a start before the winter. If planting tulips as well leave them till November to plant to prevent tulip blight. The frequent rain has filled the water butts ready for the drier times. All soft fruit is now over and it might be a good time to look up how and when to prune them. There has been a good harvest of apples from most trees. Before the winter put sticky tape or special sticky gel round the trunks of the trees to prevent moths from climbing up the tree to lay eggs in the developing fruit.

The Club Annual General Meeting and speaker meetings have been postponed until the situation allows them to restart. We hope that time won't be too long in coming! Best wishes to all our members and keep gardening.



EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP

We are pleased to announce that Eynsham Medical Group has been selected to be a recruitment site to a large scale Covid vaccine trial. The trial will be starting in mid-November and we will be seeking about 170 volunteers from our adult population from Eynsham Medical Centre and Long Hanborough Surgery to participate.

Like all of the other Covid vaccine studies it is what is called a "double blinded" trial, meaning that half of the group will get the vaccination and half will get a placebo injection of saline. The vaccination visits will take place at Eynsham Medical Centre. Some follow up visits will be required but any travel expenses will be paid for. Follow up of volunteers is for 2 years and with any Covid like illness in that timescale you would see one of the medical team to be assessed.

We look forward to the community's involvement in this important trial and the surgery's research team will make contact in due course.

NEXT STEPS FOR SALT CROSS GARDEN VILLAGE

The consultation on the Area Action Plan (AAP) for Salt Cross garden village has closed.

The next steps will see the plan submitted to the Planning Inspectorate and a Planning Inspector appointed to examine whether it is sound and legally compliant.

The examination hearings are likely to take place in January 2021, after which the inspector will produce a report. Depending on the outcome of the report, the District Council hopes to be in a position to adopt the AAP in spring 2021.

Cllr Jeff Haine, Cabinet Member for Strategic Planning, said: "The AAP that has been submitted is the culmination of two years' work which has involved extensive public consultation.

"It establishes an ambitious vision for Salt Cross garden village, underpinned by a series of key objectives and policies that will be used alongside the Local Plan and Eynsham Neighbourhood Plan to determine future development proposals. The aim is to ensure the garden village is an exemplar model of sustainable living in the 21st century."

The AAP will provide the next level of detail in the legislative framework against which the recently submitted outline planning application will be measured.

Grosvenor Britain & Ireland last month lodged an outline planning application for the Salt Cross site.

The masterplan sets out provision for 2,200 homes, new primary and secondary schools, sports facilities, parks, allotments and 57,000 sq metres of employment space. The new employment park is designed in particular to attract advanced manufacturing businesses.
