

Letter from our Curate:

Dear friends,

¹The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. ² Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. ³ They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them. ⁴ Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world. (Psalm 19:1-4)

I am writing this letter a few days after having seen an amazingly clear, quite beautiful night sky, where the stars just seemed to sparkle brighter and clearer than usual. It reminded me of Psalm 19 verses I-4 which I have quoted above, where the psalmist who may have had a similar (probably clearer) experience than mine recognised that such beauty, such order could only be the work of the creator God. In Psalm 19:1 the psalmist writes, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands." The psalmist recognises that while all of creation declares God's glory, the heavens are worthy a special mention because they are the most obviously seen of all God's works. While it is true that we can see God's glory reflected in other aspects of creation such as mountains and lakes, forests and wildlife, not everyone will have access to these places. But everyone can look up on a clear night and see the beauty of the heavens. John Glenn the American astronaut who got an even closer look at the beauty of the heavens than most of us, said "To Look at this kind of creation out here and not believe in God is impossible."

When we look up and see the beauty of the heavens, we can learn at least two things. Firstly, God is powerful, quite simply the enormity and intricacy and order of our own solar system with the sun, the moon, and the planets, tell us something about how powerful God is. Secondly, God is creative, the beauty of the heavens, the variety of shapes, sizes and colour tell us something of the creative nature of God. Saint Paul was alluding to this when he wrote in Romans 1:20, "For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities - his eternal power and divine nature - have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse."

So, this Autumn when we have clear night skies take the opportunity to look up, and ponder, who God is and what he is like.



FREELAND PARISH COUNCIL - Lisa's notes from the meeting held on 18th October 2021

Parish Council meetings - change of venue

As reported last month, the next two Parish Council meetings due to be held in November and December will be held in the Village Hall rather than the Newell Room, just to keep everyone safe as we head further into the winter months with Covid sadly still hanging around and not going anywhere anytime soon!

Inspired Villages Planning Application

No news on this at the moment, we are still awaiting a decision from the planning officer.

Bench on The Green

The existing bench on The Green is in desperate need of replacement. The Parish Council have chosen a replacement bench and I would like to pass on our thanks to the Freeland Teddy Girls who raised £429 from their recent coffee morning and sale on I6th October. What a fantastic achievement. These funds are being put towards the new bench, which has been ordered and will be installed shortly. Our thanks to everyone involved in raising these funds, it is greatly appreciated.

Local River Pollution

The Parish Council is very concerned about the increased amount of sewage being dumped in local rivers, including the River Evenlode and Windrush. A recent article in the Times detailed how the bacteria levels that were monitored in water downstream from the sewage treatment works in Church Hanborough showed E.Coli regularly at 100 times the safe limit in both wet and dry conditions. Although this location is not used for swimming, the pollution would have affected water quality further downstream. Thames Water and local Government representatives are aware of this problem, however a new Government White Paper on the Environment is due to be published soon which is hoped will provide stricter standards for water companies to adhere to. In the meantime, the Parish Council will be writing to Thames Water and Robert Courts MP to express their concerns.

Toddler Play Area upgrade

The Parish Council have been working with a small group of parents to look at updating some of the play equipment in the enclosed toddler area at the play park. The Multiplay climbing equipment with hanging tyres will be replaced with a wooden climb-on tractor, and a new covered sand pit and small trampoline will also be provided. This work is being funded through the use of \$106 funds received from the Mears Homes development on the A4095. Please note the installation of the new equipment is currently due to start on **22nd November** so the toddler area will be out of use during this time whilst the work is carried out.

Building a Better Freeland through Neighbourhood Planning

Following on from last month's report, Freeland Parish Council and several interested Freeland residents are due to meet with WODC soon to kick start the Neighbourhood Planning process.

I would like to reiterate my report from last month...... With the need for sustainable, affordable housing in the right place raised many times in the past in responses to various planning proposals, the Parish Council has decided that it would like to start the Neighbourhood Planning process by setting up a working group and holding exploratory discussions with West Oxfordshire District Council., but we need lots more hands to make this happen. We would therefore like to ask whether anyone interested in supporting Neighbourhood Planning in any way, big or small – or even if you just want to find out more at this stage – to please get in contact with me at lisa.fpc@gmail.com. Time is pressing. Pressure for speculative development is growing, and grants to help create Neighborhood Plans are running out. However, we can develop the future we want for Freeland, but it needs to be with your help. Please do get in touch to offer assistance if you can.

Road Closure - Cuckoo Lane

A reminder about the upcoming temporary road closure that is due to take place as follows: North Leigh, Cuckoo Lane (past the sawmill turn, near edge of Broadmarsh Woods) – Thames Water works. Road closed from 8th – 17th November inclusive This will be a 24-hour closure.

Exemptions for this closure are included for police, fire and ambulance services and for the works vehicles and for access to premises which are only accessible from the closed section of road.

Yellow Rattle Trial Sites

Work on the trial sites has started, and two areas of The Green have been scarified and a wildflower mix of seeds including Yellow Rattle have been sown. A section of the Broadmarsh Lane amenity area has also been prepared and seed sown. The next areas to be planted are the two grass verges at the entrance to Oakland Close and the grass verge at the end of Parklands by the entrance to the woods.

Freeland Parish Council are keen to support the Freeland Naturehood's efforts to extend wildlife corridors and the work carried out so far should create some beautiful wildflower verges throughout the village which should look really pretty, plus they will be beneficial to wildlife as well.

The Parish Council would like to pass on their thanks to Russell Fisher, Amanda Watson and Robert Crocker for all their hard work on this project, plus the volunteers who provided assistance in preparing the areas. Traffic Calming in Freeland

The Traffic Calming group met this month and revisited its aims and objectives in trying to slow the speed of traffic through the village and to prevent HGVs coming through Freeland by encouraging them to take a different route at the village gateways. Sadly, according to the data collected by the Freeland Speedwatch team and from feedback received from the local police, a lot of the speeding being done through Freeland is by our own residents! Something to think about perhaps when you next drive through the village!

The Parish Council has also been advised that OCC is changing its approach and acceptance of 20mph restrictions which will enable much greater coverage across Oxfordshire. Parishes can apply to introduce a **20mph** speed restriction in their village, as long as they have support from the local county councillor. Measures supported will be from a simple change of speed signs to more complex solutions in areas that can range from a whole village or a single street. Speed cameras and road humps will not be used. This new initiative has literally just been approved by OCC Cabinet and is likely to be hugely popular so things may not move as quickly as we would like, but it is something that will be explored further by the Traffic Calming group.

Good Neighbour Scheme

West Oxfordshire District Council are looking at resurrecting and improving the Good Neighbour Scheme that was set up a few years ago in conjunction with Volunteer Link Up in Witney. A new way of allowing people to volunteer in their local community is currently being explored, and I will post further details when I know more. What has been clear throughout this past year or so, is how much people have got out of volunteering and helping others, and it would be great to provide an easy way for people to continue to do this. FREELAND SPEEDWATCH

Since our local Speedwatch team of nine volunteers resumed activity in early September, 21 sessions have been conducted. During these sessions 1928 vehicles have been recorded in total, 189 (or nearly 10%) of which were travelling in excess of 35mph. Of these 189, 138 were doing 36-40mph, 40 were doing 41-45mph, 6 were doing 46-50mph and 5 were doing in excess of 50mph. The fastest was recorded at 63mph travelling from the village centre towards The Green.



Members of the team operate at different locations, on varying days of the week and at various times of the day so anyone speeding through Freeland is likely to be caught. The data is then submitted to Thames Valley Police who will take appropriate action.

Keeping to the **30mph** limit throughout the village will avoid police action, but more importantly will ensure that Freeland remains a lovely and safe place to live



FREELAND VILLAGE HUB update from FCBS Management Team

It is now nearly five years since the Methodist Church was closed for worship and since then this iconic building, which has stood in the heart of the Village for 200 years, has remained unused.

When its impending closure was announced, it was assumed that it would be offered for sale and Freeland Community Benefit Society Ltd. (FCBS) was formed, as a



legal entity, to take on the task of acquiring it for a community owned and volunteer run Village "Hub", incorporating a cafe and shop. Many Villages are running such enterprises in redundant Churches and other buildings and it is a facility that Freeland has lacked since the Village shop in Parklands closed 15 years ago. The Methodist Church at the time indicated to us that they hoped that it would continue to be used for a community purpose.

The FCBS Management Team (MT) successfully applied to WODC for planning permission for use of the building for commercial purposes and were instrumental in having a submission for residential development by the Methodist Church refused. The MT have a well developed business plan and have continued with fund raising events. Support from Freeland residents was received in the form of pledges of over £70,000 in response to a share offer.

The failure of the Methodist Church to offer the Church for sale and to engage with the community continues to be a source of frustration and the work of the MT is currently in abeyance. Two of our members: Jane Duff and Anna Tighe have resigned and we would like to thank them for the time and effort they have put into supporting the project over the last few years, in particular by the organisation of regular fund raising events for our fighting fund.

Recently the MT have been in discussion with Tom and Alice Harden, Freeland's Micro Bakery (Knead Bakehouse), who have been operating very successfully during the pandemic and who have indicated that they would like to expand their business by purchasing the Methodist Church for a combined bakery, cafe and community space. In the view of the MT this currently offers a more direct and feasible approach to achieving FCBS's objective of having a social hub in the centre of the Village, than a community funded initiative and we are supporting their proposal. A long time has passed and much has changed in the Village since we first circulated the questionnaire regarding the future of the Methodist Church, which indicated strong support for the concept of acquiring it for use as a Community hub. However we believe that there is still a desire to see this building used for something of value to the Community rather than being developed for residential use and we will continue to pursue this objective.

SALT CROSS AAP & HANBOROUGH STATION MASTERPLAN UPDATE

Salt Cross Area Action Plan (AAP)

Following the Council's submission of Salt Cross Area Action Plan to the Planning Inspectorate in February, examination hearing sessions were held 28 June – 8 July. Subsequently, the Inspector paused the examination and invited the Council to undertake some further work on the phasing of community infrastructure.

Once this work is complete, the next stage is to move towards publication of 'main modifications' of Salt Cross Area Action Plan which the Council will consult on to give everyone the opportunity to comment on the modifications made to the Area Action Plan through the inspection process, before it is adopted by the Council.

Hanborough Station Masterplan

The District Council and Oxfordshire County Council are working closely to scope out a brief and invite consultants to prepare a new masterplan for Hanborough Station.

The masterplan will build on and develop previous work prepared for the District Council which looked at initial opportunities for enhancing the role of Hanborough Station a key transport hub.

TEMPORARY CLOSURES OF HOUSEHOLD WASTE CENTRES

Oxfordshire County Council, the authority in charge of the sites, will be closing down the Household Waste Recycling Centres on random days in November to carry out deep cleaning and 'essential' maintenance.

This includes jet washing the sites and structures, repainting lines and safety areas, and carrying out work to improve the customer experience.

The council will be shutting each of its centres for two days - although never at the same time.

The closing dates are:

Alkerton, near Banbury: Tuesday 2 and Wednesday 3 November

Ardley, near Bicester: Thursday 4 and Friday 5 November

Dix Pit, Stanton Harcourt: Tuesday 23 and Wednesday 24 November

Drayton, near Abingdon: Tuesday 9 and Wednesday 10 November

Oakley Wood, near Wallingford: Tuesday 16 and Wednesday 17 November

Redbridge, Oxford: Thursday 18 and Friday 19 November

Stanford, near Farringdon: Thursday 11 and Friday 12 November.

All closures will happen on quieter weekdays to minimise disruption and will reopen at 8am the following day.

Residents are asked to plan ahead, and hold on to waste until the sites reopens, or if this is impossible to use the nearest alternative site.

Residents with van or trailer permits can use these at any of the HWRCs.






EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP UPDATE

We are having **Covid Booster Vaccination** clinics on Friday afternoons and Saturday mornings. Do please note that the <u>earliest</u> this can be given is 6 months after you received your second Vaccine. Please do not try to make an appointment earlier as you will not be given the booster vaccination on arrival.



If you are eligible for a Covid Booster do please check the on-line booking status regularly as these appointments will be released as we have confirmation that the vaccine will be available.

You will be contacted individually when your turn comes for either the Flu vaccine or Covid Booster.

If you have access to book on-line this is the best way to book your appointment and can be done via the

NHS App: www.nhsapp.service.nhs.uk/login or

Patient Access: www.patientaccess.com

Our **Vaccine booking line** is still available for patients who cannot book online. This is open between **09.00** and **14.00** Monday to Friday **01993 880786**. Be patient, it is often very busy.

Please note, it is vital to turn up for your appointment in order to obtain the best protection you can against serious symptoms of either the Flu or Covid in what may be a difficult Winter for those (and other) viral infections.

If you are eligible but have not had either the first or second Covid Vaccination, then arrange to have them as soon as possible at the following website:

www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/book-coronavirus-vaccination. If you cannot book appointments on-line, you can call 119 free of charge. You can speak to a translator if you need to.


