Letter from our Associate Rector, Rev. Mike Madden:

Dear Friends,

When having a moan is a good thing - God's gift of lament for difficult times

¹ How long, Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? ² How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and day after day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me? ³ Look on me and answer, Lord my God. Give light to my eyes, or I will sleep in death, ⁴ and my enemy will say, "I have overcome him," and my foes will rejoice when I fall. ⁵ But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. (Psalm 13:1-5)

Over the last few years, it would be an understatement to say that we have lived through 'interesting times', with BREXIT, COVID, the Russian invasion of Ukraine, high energy prices, the cost-of-living crisis and most recently rising mortgage interest rates. In times of adversity, it is easy feel that God is a long way off, certainly the author of Psalm I3 thought so. However, the psalmist's difficulties, whatever they were, did not stop them praying honesty to the Lord. The Bible calls this way of praying lament. It is a gift from God to help us draw close to God during the tough times.

In psalms of lament, we see the psalmist crying out to God in sorrow, sometimes protesting about an injustice, or quite simply being honest about their own struggles. So how does lament work and why does God encourage his people to lament? Below are three reasons why lament is a good thing that can help us during difficult times.

- Lament remembers there Is a God who Is real Simply by pausing for a moment and telling God how we really feel we are recognising that God is, that he exists, and that he is interested in us.
- Lament remembers and can ask why? Lament does not sweep troubles under the carpet, rather lament allows us to be real, to express our struggles and frustrations honestly to God.
- Lament moves us from despair to hope Somehow by God's grace, when we are honest with God, God in his grace works in us and our situation. Time and again in the psalms we see the psalmist moving from despair to hope. God has grown bigger, and the challenge being faced smaller.

On a personal note, I have learned to use lament when I pray. Often on long walks around Farmoor reservoir I would tell God what I really thought. During those times, I would gain wisdom, perspective, and sometimes see answers to prayer. But mostly I would be filled with a deep sense of the presence of God as I realised afresh that God was with me. My prayer for all of us is that no matter how tough the times we live in are, that through the gift of lament we would all experience more of God's presence in our lives.







Who are your Parish Councillors? Amy Jackson

I moved to Freeland 18 years ago and live on The Green with my husband Greg, three (rescue) dogs and five hens. Although I don't come from a farming background, I've worked in the agriculture industry in one way or another since I was 14, starting with stints in a lambing shed then moving on to agricultural college, work on livestock and arable farms in the UK and Canada, for cattle breeding companies and auctioneers, and then for large and small agricultural PR consultancies.

For much of the past 12 years I've worked for myself, specialising in helping UK farming deal with



issues and crisis – of which there have been a quite a few! I've been lucky (or unlucky depending on your perspective!) to have been involved in quite a few high profile stories such as the horsemeat scandal, concern over 'megafarms', and antibiotic use.

The great news is my job is easier because we have some really good farmers in the UK, who make use of our natural resources like rain and grass and straw to produce dairy and meat that is far lower impact and higher welfare than many other countries.

We've also done a brilliant job stewarding antibiotic use – farmers and vets really rose to the challenge of antibiotic resistance and halved use of products over five years.



UDATE ON INSPIRED VILLAGE'S APPEAL AGAINST THE RETIREMENT VILLAGE REFUSAL - Come to the Inquiry Opening!

As you will be aware, Inspired Villages have not accepted WODC's unanimous refusal of its application to build 160 retirement homes on land in the grounds of Freeland House, having now lodged an appeal with the Planning Inspectorate (PINS).

Freeland Parish Council and Freeland Friends (the group of residents that were so active in campaigning against the original application) have joined forces and are now recognised by PINS as an official 'Rule 6 party'. This means we are formally involved in the inquiry process.

As such, this has meant (so far) an online scoping meeting with the Inspector, and the submission of our evidence on the case against the development to PINS. In turn, we have also received the evidence the appellant has submitted in a bid to have the planning refusal by West Oxfordshire District Council overturned, and the evidence from WODC defending its refusal.

We are being ably helped by planning consultant Mike Gilbert, who lives in the village and is co-ordinating our efforts. Mike will be giving evidence at the Inquiry, as will Amy Jackson, and Roger Faulkner, who will deliver the opening and closing statements.

The case we are building is based on four points: the site is unsustainable; the scale, density and height of the proposed development are inappropriate; the development would harm the character, appearance and landscape of the village; and there are cumulative effects of new developments in the surrounding area. The evidence submitted includes a video which tells the story of what it is like to live in Freeland, and an assessment of light impact conducted. We have also created documents examining the policy issues and local impact. Thanks go out to a number of volunteers from the Parish Council and Freeland Friends who spent many, many hours compiling the rest of the data and other evidence that will help the village fight this.

The inquiry starts at **I0am on Tuesday 8th November** at Woodgreen council offices in Witney, and is expected to last until Friday 11th November.

We have one last 'ask' of Freeland residents: come to the opening of the Inquiry! Simply by being there, the Planning Inspector will see the strength of feeling.

To help you get there, we have laid on a 50-seater bus to take residents to the opening of the Inquiry – meet at Freeland Village Hall at 9am on 8 November (see full page ad promoting this on page 23 of this issue). While the Inquiry starts at 10am, you will have a chance to leave at the morning break or at lunch – the bus will take you back at either time.

We will also keep you posted on progress. Whatever the eventual outcome of this appeal, it's important we feel we've done what we can to fight it.





EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP UPDATES

APPOINTMENT SYSTEM CHANGES

We have worked hard with patients to redesign our system and launched this on 1st September 2022. We were not able to recruit to our preferred level of staffing before going live with this, due to the staff shortages felt everywhere at the moment.

The aim is to enable us to best meet patients' needs by considering their preference for appointment type and timings, directing them to the most appropriate person within our team, and by trying to maintain continuity with their usual GP or other team member.

A reminder of how this works:

You will be able to book an appointment:

- By using the econsult tool online (we hope to change this to a simpler online form soon). This is on the first page of our website www.eynshammedicalgroup.org.uk
- By telephoning our reception team during working hours
- Long Hanborough Surgery: 01993 881330
- Eynsham Surgery: 01865 881206
- In person at either practice
- Online: nurse, healthcare assistants, and clinical pharmacist (blood tests, injections, cervical smears, and chronic disease or medication reviews). The link for this is also on the first page of our website

Our reception staff have been trained to gather some basic information to enable a doctor to assess who might best help you. We will also ask the urgency of your need, the person you would like to contact, your preferred appointment type (phone/face-to-face/email or text), when you are unavailable, and your preferred mode of contact (text/email/phone). The more information you can provide the easier this makes it for our team and the more likely we will be able to offer you a suitable and convenient appointment.

Due to staff shortages the time taken to gather this information has sometimes led to longer wait times on the telephone. To combat this, we are still actively recruiting to our reception team. Training of new and existing staff is going well.

We ask that while we acknowledge how frustrating the wait can be for some patients that you do not take frustrations out on our staff, who are working extremely hard to serve our patients.



FREELAND COMMUNITY BENEFIT SOCIETY - VILLAGE HUB PROJECT - UPDATE

As you may have seen in the Flyer recently sent to all households, Spitfire Homes claim that it is no longer possible to re-purpose the Methodist Church for use as a Community shop and cafe as the Oxfordshire Methodist Circuit do not intend to sell it to Freeland CBS. We would like to make it clear that we have had no correspondence with Spitfire



Homes regarding the Church or their proposal for the development of the Chapel Field that includes provision for a shop and cafe. The Circuit has not communicated to FCBS any change to their previously stated intention to obtain the best price for the Church on the open market. Following an application from FCBS in August of this year WODC have renewed the lapsed permission for change of use of the Church for a shop and cafe. The proposal from the Circuit for its development for a single dwelling is currently being considered by WODC. This has received over 70 objections from residents, along with those from FCBS, Freeland PC and WODC's own Business Development Officer.

We continue to think that the Church is the ideal location for a Community Hub and that such a unique building that has served the Methodist and the wider Freeland Community for over 200 years should not be sacrificed for a single dwelling. We believe that we have the support of the Freeland Community in this endeavour.

Shops are only one of the many ventures that communities own and run as social enterprises – these include pubs, recreational facilities, power generation and even community housing. It was the 3rd visit of our speaker, Malcolm Moody, to the Club to talk about Orchids. His subject this time was Orchid Hunting in Ecuador but it also turned out to be a bit of a travelogue because the holiday had included a visit to Peru. He showed wonderful photos of the journey into Manchu Pichu as well as other places they had visited first. He had some wonderful pictures of the unusual Orchids they had found, some journeys to find the flowers were climbing through bush, etc. He showed Orchids whose centre had developed into what looked like a bee or insect similar to those insects that pollinated the flower. It was a very interesting talk and he will be booked to come again in 2024 to do his final talk of Looking after Orchids in the Home.

The Club AGM will be held on **Monday 24th October at 7.30pm** in Freeland Hall. After the business there will be tea/coffee, cake and cheese and biscuits but no speaker.

Autumn has certainly arrived in our gardens. It is a time of clearing summer bedding and spent perennials. After rain it is a good time to mulch the beds as well. Cut down buddleia flowers by a about half. Prune climbing roses and and cut bush roses down by half. Take out dead and crossing branches. Feed the lawn, net ponds and water features to prevent leaves falling in. Rake up leaves. Don't put apples with grey mould and brown rot on the compost heap as the spores may affect future crops, put them in your green bin.

Cut down the canes of summer raspberries and keep some new shoots to fruit next year. Harvest celeriac and squashes and beans if they are still not finished. Pick fruit when ripe and comes off the tree with a slight twist. Plant winter salads in a sunny spot or cold greenhouse.

LONGER HANBOROUGH

As you may know, an application for outline planning permission to build 150 homes on the field north of the Witney Road (A4095) is scheduled to be determined by the Uplands Area Planning Sub-Committee at its meeting on 14th November at WODC offices in Witney. You are all welcome to attend to observe or read out statements at the start.

As your elected representative and a member of Uplands, I have a legal obligation to consider every application with an open mind and cast my vote after giving due regard to all the evidence including the applicant's submission, the planning officers' assessment, and comments from statutory consultees, the Parish Council and the many submissions by residents. Since the decision is quasi-judicial and is based on the interpretation and application of various planning policies, it often takes a robust discussion among fellow members to make sure that it is clearly and soundly based on specific policy provisions. Many of you will know the planning history of this parcel of land known as "the North Field" starting with an application in April 2017 for 170 homes which was subsequently revised down to 161 homes. At a meeting of Uplands in December 2017 members resolved to accept the planning officer's recommendation to grant approval subject to the conclusion of some legal agreements. At the time, the District's Local Plan 2031 was "emerging", i.e., going through the process of examination by a planning inspector. The submitted Local Plan did not include the North Field as one of the strategic sites needed to meet the housing supply. On 30 April 2018 Uplands reconsidered the application in light of new archaeological evidence and the increasing legal weight being assigned to the emerging Local Plan and so resolved to refuse permission.

WODC formally adopted the Local Plan 2031 on 27 September 2018 and is now in the process of conducting a statutory review/update. Up until the Council meeting on 20 July 2022 the Council continued to claim it had a deliverable housing land supply in excess of 5 years as required under the Local Plan. Yet, this claim could not be demonstrated at an appeal inquiry held during 27 June – 6 July and the inspector found, in a judgement issued on 10 August, that the land supply was nearer 3.7 years. This has meant that the Local Plan is not up-to-date and so has lost weight in planning decisions and, as a result, a number of previously refused schemes around the district have been resurrected for potential approval under the National Planning Policy Framework with its presumption in favour of sustainable development unless there are clear reasons for refusal under policies in this Framework.

I have submitted more than a dozen written questions and will try to get to the bottom of this. In response to one of my questions at the meeting of the Cabinet of the new Alliance administration on 12 October, I was told: "Whilst I acknowledge that the District Council cannot currently demonstrate a 5-year supply of deliverable housing land, this is not a planning crisis, rather it is a common issue faced by many local authorities and requires a measured and robust plan of action. The Council is currently in the process of finalising a new Housing Land Supply Position Statement and Officers have been seeking additional information from landowners and developers to provide clearer evidence of anticipated delivery. It is anticipated that the updated position statement will be published later this month.

Alongside this, the review of the Local Plan provides the opportunity to consider future housing needs and identify additional housing sites in a plan-led manner in consultation with local communities and other key stakeholders."

ADVANCE WARNING OF ROAD CLOSURES



To enable the construction of the new Park and Ride site being built near Eynsham, Oxfordshire County Council will implement a temporary road closure and speed restriction change along Cuckoo Lane from **Monday 24th October**.

A portion of Cuckoo Lane (from A40 heading northwards for 300m to the electricity substation) will be closed overnight (8pm-6am) from Monday 24th October to Saturday 12th November. There will be a speed limit




