

Letter from our Rector, Rev. Steve Stewart:

It is an outstanding cultural feature of the West at present that we are encouraged to define ourselves ever more narrowly. The ever-narrowing self-definitions relate to almost every conceivable category of the human condition: skin colour, ethnic background, gender, political allegiance, whether or not we consume certain foods, and more.

Such divisions provide fodder for some individuals or political movements to demonise or dehumanise those who do not fall into our particular self-defined category. We should be wary of this. Debate and disagreement without violence or favour, and especially without dehumanisation is the very bedrock of a civilised society where all have the opportunity to flourish – even those with whom I disagree.

As the American church minister and theologian Tim Keller once said, "Friends become wiser together through a healthy clash of viewpoints."*

Disagreement is not an opportunity for exploitative division and dehumanisation, but for the building of even stronger relationships. This kind of disagreement is also the way of Christ and his followers. As Peter, one of Jesus apostles and his friend, observes in one of his letters in the Bible:

"Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect" (1 Pet. 3:15).

For the Christian, difference is to be met with a listening ear not irrational fear! This is not to make us bland and homogenous, but to bring us to a place where we can have that "healthy clash of viewpoints". As Mahatma Gandhi once put it: "Honest disagreement is often a good sign of progress".

But more than all this, it is the way of Jesus Christ not to see dislikeable difference in others, not to define ourselves so narrowly that all but those in our bubble become "the enemy", but rather to see above all things our common humanity, the very image of God in all:

"God created humankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them" (Genesis 1:27).



WODC Local Plan

Focused consultation on ideas and objectives (30 August - 25 October 2023) - LIVE

Building on the feedback received to our initial consultation last year, we are running an 8-week focused consultation from 30 August - 25 October 2023 based around three particular elements:

- **Draft local plan objectives** a series of draft objectives which are intended to guide the future evolution of the plan in terms of its overall approach and anticipated policy content;
- The future pattern of development in West Oxfordshire different scenarios for how and where we might look to focus future growth in the period up to 2041:
- Call for sites, ideas and opportunities an open invitation for stakeholders to put forward their thoughts on how land in the district might be used in the future such as new housing, employment, infrastructure, community use, green space, nature recovery and renewable energy.

John gave us a very informative insight into his career, right from the beginning when he was a young police constable at St Aldates. His work took a direction he never could have imagined and led him into becoming a recognised expert on critical incident management. Some of his cases



included Princess Diana's funeral route to Northampton and a bomb scare at Royal Ascot, following the arrival of the Royal party. When he retired, he envisaged a quieter life but was approached by Vodafone to be involved with their work supporting domestic abuse victims. John demonstrated how mobile technology is playing a vital role in helping people get access to information and help and saving lives. John was a very engaging and informative speaker who clearly loved the paths his career has taken. Passing around his OBE medal at the end seemed a very fitting finale.

At our next meeting on **Monday 9th October**, our speaker will be Jan Warner who will give us a brief overview on how our ancestors raised their infants. Her talk is entitled 'Survival of the Fittest.'

Throughout the year we have continued to support the Witney food bank at our meetings. Our donations are delivered by one of our committee members, Maggie, who volunteers there.

Maggie, and Marilyn, our treasurer, have bravely offered to do another sponsored walk in aid of our WI funds. 




