

Public meeting: Salt Cross and speed limits in Freeland

On **Friday 14th of October** in Freeland Village Hall from **7.30pm** we are hosting an open public meeting to update all Freeland Residents on the Salt Cross housing development and the possible introduction of a 20mph speed limit in parts of Freeland. There will be a number of experts present who will help answer any questions. We do ask that questions be sent in advance to the Parish Clerk, Fay Friend, at

fayf.fpc@gmail.com so that they can be collated and possibly answered during the presentation but there will still be a question and answer session at the end. Parish Council response to retirement village appeal

As many will now be aware, Inspired Villages/Legal & General has not accepted WODC's refusal of its application to build 160 retirement homes on land in the grounds of Freeland House, having now lodged an appeal with the Planning Inspectorate. The process (more information at https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/ planning-appeals-dealt-with-by-an-inquiry-taking-part) is underway and we will hear more about the timescales in due course. The process is that the Planning Inspectorate will review the decision and all of the evidence, hold a public inquiry (which is likely to be some time next year), and then make a decision to either allow the appeal (and therefore WODC's refusal is overturned), or dismiss the appeal (in which case WODC's refusal stands).

More about the case that Inspired Villages is making against WODC's decision can be found on the WODC website planning portal (**www.westoxon.gov.uk/planning**), reference **21/02627/OUT**.

Freeland Parish Council are acutely aware of the strong feelings of many in the village who objected to this proposal (253 in total), and the Council itself submitted a detailed objection, believing this development is not appropriate for Freeland.

While this appeal is principally about Inspired Villages vs WODC, we have considered what can be done to support the case against this development and convey the strong feelings of so many residents.

To this end, we are planning to join forces with Freeland Friends, the group of residents which did so much last year to inform and drum up engagement with this issue within the village, and who are mobilising again; village resident Mike Gilbert, a planning consultant, has kindly agreed to support and steer efforts. The aim is that together, we will submit an application to the Planning Inspectorate to become what is known as a 'Rule 6' party. If accepted, this means that Freeland Parish Council/Freeland Friends will have a higher status in the process and will be able to make representations/present evidence at the public inquiry.

While it is normal for Rule 6 parties to secure the services of a barrister, this is costly. So in the event we are granted Rule 6 status, we will be likely to present our own evidence. This means we will be asking residents for any help they can provide with legal knowledge and also specific evidence we will be compiling. But we also need help with things like leaflet drops and general support. ADVANCE WARNING OF ROAD CLOSURES



To enable the construction of the new Park and Ride site being built near Eynsham, Oxfordshire County Council will implement a temporary road closure and speed restriction change along Cuckoo Lane from **Monday 19th September**.

A portion of Cuckoo Lane (from A40 heading northwards for 300m) will be closed overnight (8pm-6am) as required, while during the day the road (up to the entrance for SSE electrical substation) will have a speed limit reduction from 60mph to 30mph. From the substation until the entrance for Cuckoo Wood Farm, the speed limit will be reduced from 60mph to 50mph.

The County Council estimates that the Park and Ride construction project will be completed by the end **December 2023**.

The effect of the traffic order is to temporarily prohibit any vehicle proceeding along that section of The Green. 



EYNSHAM MEDICAL GROUP UPDATES PLANNED APPOINTMENT SYSTEM CHANGES

During the pandemic, NHS England mandated the use of telephone appointments. However, we recognise this has been difficult for some people. We have worked hard with patients to redesign our system and recruit sufficient staff to launch this on **Thursday 1st September 2022**.



We hope the new system will enable us to best meet patients' V needs by considering their preference for appointment type and timings, directing them to the most appropriate person within our team, and by trying to maintain continuity with their usual GP or other team member.

You will be able to book an appointment:

- » By using the "eConsult" tool online which is at the top on the first page of our website (we hope to change this to a simpler online form soon)
- » By telephoning our reception team during working hours
- » In person at either practice
- » Online: nurse, healthcare assistants, and clinical pharmacist (blood tests, injections, cervical smears, and chronic disease or medication reviews)

Our reception staff have been trained to gather some basic information to enable a doctor to assess who might best help you. We will also ask the urgency of your need, the person you would like to contact, your preferred appointment type (phone/face-to-face/ email or text), when you are unavailable, and your preferred mode of contact (text/email/ phone). The more information you can provide the easier this makes it for our team and the more likely we will be able to offer you a suitable and convenient appointment.

Your request will be triaged within 24 hours by a GP. Urgent issues will be triaged and dealt with the same day. Our team will use your preferred contact method to let you know what day and time we can offer you an appointment – it is easiest if we can text you unless this is difficult. We will do our best to offer your preferred type of appointment. Appointments will be bookable 3 weeks in advance. If the time you are offered is not convenient, we ask that you ring our reception team to change it.

Thank you for your patience as we implement these changes. We really value feedback and would appreciate any thoughts you have about how the new system is working after its launch. You can submit these through our website or in writing using the suggestions boxes in our waiting rooms.

VACCINE CLINICS THROUGHOUT THE AUTUMN

Our Covid vaccination clinics continue on Friday mornings at Long Hanborough Surgery and are bookable online or by phoning the practice. Please only phone us if the online option is not available to you.

Our Flu vaccination clinics will begin on Saturdays from mid-September.

These will be held at both Long Hanborough Surgery and Eynsham Medical Centre. We will be calling patients 65 years or over and those in the 'at-risk' groups to attend from the second week in September. *Continued*.....

This year our flu vaccination clinics will not be pre-bookable. We will be running walk in clinics for those who have been contacted. To make sure we have the capacity to vaccinate everyone attending each clinic we will be contacting patients, inviting them to attend on certain dates. You will be invited to attend the site which is closest to you. If you cannot make the date you have been offered there is no need to contact us to let us know as you will be contacted again to attend a subsequent clinic.

Invitations will be sent out as text, email, or letter. If anyone receiving a letter has an email address or smart phone that we could use to contact them in the future, we would appreciate it very much if you would inform us. The best way to let us know this is via our eConsult service using the admin option.

We will be running very large clinics in a time of staff shortages. Please consider that our phone lines need to be used for patients with medical problems, PLEASE DO NOT RING THE SURGERY TO ENQUIRE WHEN YOU MIGHT BE INVITED.

In July we had an interesting talk entitled Visits, Views and Vistas given by Avril Hughes. She showed slides of mainly large gardens which had parkland beyond the formal gardens. Some had cut a hole through a hedge giving views of the parkland beyond, others had an arch to look through and some buildings had an ornate window making the longer view visible. Most of us do not have a parkland view beyond the end of our gardens but she encouraged us to make the most of anything of interest. She showed pictures of gardens she encouraged us to visit, some of which we have already visited as a Gardening Club outing.

During August, the Club doesn't have a speaker, sometimes a party has been organised. This year however we are going on an outing with an evening visit to Bridewell Organic Garden in Wilcott on **Monday 22nd August.** This is a garden which provides gardening as a restorative therapy for those with mental health problems. Many people have had tremendous benefit from their work as a gardener there. There is a small team of fulltime staff but most of the gardening duties are done by volunteers. If anyone is interested in going, please contact Brian Wildblood on **01993 883968** as you may still have a chance to join us. We are travelling in private cars leaving from Freeland Hall car park at **6pm**.

On **Monday 26th September at 7.30pm** in Freeland Hall Malcolm Moody will tell us about 'Orchid Hunting in Ecuador'. He is sure to have many photographs of his trip there. There is a Bring and Buy Plant and Gardening Club sale at all the Hall meetings so if you have spare plants do bring them along.

Jobs for the next few weeks involve watering where most needed, but NOT lawns. As Autumn approaches after this very dry period cut down any flowers that have died or finished flowering, leaving some seedheads for wildlife. Plan Spring displays by ordering bulbs or later planting wallflowers, etc. to go through the winter and flower in the Spring. Cut back and leave dahlia tubers to dry before wrapping up in newspaper and storing somewhere frost free. Empty summer pots and replace with a winter display. In the fruit garden harvest apples, pears and plums as well as raspberries, blackberries and other soft fruit not yet picked. Put sticky bands round apple trees to prevent the codling moth climbing up in the spring and laying eggs in the fruit.

Harvest sweetcorn when the fronds turn brown and the corn looks ready when some of the leaves are peeled back. Divide rhubarb by chopping the crown into pieces, each with a bud and replant the same way up. Turn the compost heap and clean all tools, etc. Many other jobs also need doing.


